Background

At a Special Council Meeting held on 24 April 2018 Council endorsed the submission of an Expression of Interest (EOI) to the Department of Infrastructure, Regional Development and Cities for the Regional Growth Fund to secure funding for a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre.

Further, in anticipation of the EOI being favourably assessed, Council also resolved that it;

- *i) endorses the continued development of the full business case for the building and operation of a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre as proposed in the EOI;*
- *ii)* endorses funding of \$80,000 to enable more detailed architectural design, project management, costings and associated work to be prepared to satisfy the criteria of a full business case submission;
- *iii)* engages with a broad range of stakeholders in developing the design and functionality of the proposed centre;
- *iv)* continues to lobby the State Government for a funding commitment of not less than \$ 10 million as a vital portion of funding for the construction of the Sport and Recreation Centre;
- v) resolves for the Councillor Working Party to be continued and seeks nominations for participation in the next stage of development work for the proposed Sport and Recreation Centre, and
- vi) reviews the full business case for stage two of the application process prior to the submission deadline (date not yet known), confirming Councillor commitment to the funding application for the proposed Sport and Recreation Centre.

The Councillor Working Party referred to in the abovementioned resolution was convened to support the administration in progressing the Regional Sport and Recreation Centre concept to a stage where a funding Expression of Interest could be submitted.

The resolution proposes that the Councillor Working Party continue and that nominations be sought for the next stage of development.

Discussion

With the Expression of Interest now submitted a significant body of work must be progressed in readiness for stage two of the Department of Infrastructure, Regional Development and Cities application process.

This work is expected to occur over the next 5 months including the caretaker period for the 2018 local government elections that commences 4 September 2018 and may continue into the next Council Term depending on the timing of the grant application as determined by the Federal Government.

Whilst the Councillor Working Party has provided an agile and efficient short-term solution to assist the Chief Executive Officer and administration in dealing with the very short timeframes associated with the Expression of Interest process, such an arrangement does not provide the level of formality, transparency and accountability envisaged by the Local Government Act 1999, particularly for a project of such significance.



It is proposed that in lieu of a Councillor Working Party, a formal Section 41 Committee be established that reports directly to Council for the purpose of considering and making recommendations on matters relating to the proposed Regional Sport and Recreation Centre.

The meetings of such a committee would, appropriately, be held in a place open to the public with publication of formal agendas and minutes on the Council website and unless specific delegations are granted, all recommendations would be presented to Council for final decision and resolution.

A draft Terms of Reference have been prepared and are attached to this Report (Attachment 1) for consideration by Council in determining whether to establish a Committee for this purpose.

Conclusion

To give effect to the proposed establishment of a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre Committee this report presents a recommendation from the Chief Executive Officer in accordance with Regulation 21 of the Local Government (Procedures at Meetings) Regulations that:

• Council revoke its resolution dated 24 April 2018 November 2017 for the Councillor Working Party to be continued

This report further recommends the establishment of a formal Section 41 Committee for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations to Council on matters relating to a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre and adoption of a Draft Terms of Reference.

A subsequent report (Council Report No. AR18/17807) provides a nomination and appointment process for membership of a newly established Committee should Council so resolve in that manner.

Background

Council provides cash and in kind support for a number of major and other events each year to promote both tourism and community wellbeing through cultural and arts programs. The Limestone Coast Opera (LCO) first received sponsorship from Council in 2016. The following table providing details of the sponsorship received and the estimated number of attendees.

Discussion

Limestone Coast Opera was incorporated in 2016 and is a relatively new group seeking to build upon the evolving music and performance reputation of Mount Gambier. Council sponsorship of emerging events has seen a strong events culture develop over time with the following summary table providing some comparative data for a number of different types of Council sponsored events. In general, the level of funding has reflected the number of participants/ attendees at the supported events.

The submission for sponsorship made by the LCO noted that it received County Arts funding of \$12,000 in 2017 and no funding in 2018. The LCO will be seeking a range of corporate sponsors with gold sponsorship suggested at \$20,000 - \$25,000. The predicted budget for the 2019 program is \$135,000.

Conclusion

LCO requests that the City of Mount Gambier become a major sponsor of the 2019 program with the main prize for the event being renamed as the *Limestone Coast Opera Inc. City of Mount Gambier Aria Awards*. The level of funding requested is a significant increase on funding granted in previous years and exceeds the draft budget allocation of \$5,000 made for the 2018/19 financial year.



This report presents Council with a summary of relevant information to inform what if any budget increase may be proposed. Funding partners for the 2018 Fringe in Mount Gambier included Country Arts SA via Arts SA with a contribution of \$10,000 toward the festival, SATC sponsored the event to the value of \$10,000 toward marketing activities and the City of Mount Gambier contributed \$20,000 cash and \$5,000 in-kind. Due to a conservative budget, additional sponsorship of \$5,250 secured from the community proved invaluable with securing artists.

A key consideration from the evaluation of the inaugural event held in 2017 was for local management/facilitation of the showcase event to encourage an increase in participation from artists, venues and businesses to leverage value add activity. This consideration was actively pursued in the delivery of the 2018 event with remarkable results. The organising committee curated the showcase event held on 23 & 24 March 2018. A further 10 businesses and venues provided additional ticketed events that extended the overall program offered to the community (Attachment 1).

An evaluation has been undertaken by the organising committee to seek feedback from the curators, artists, venue operators and businesses. Information provided will guide the ongoing development of a community led cultural event that can deliver social, cultural and economic benefits for the City of Mount Gambier.

Discussion

The 2018 Fringe in Mount Gambier Festival was delivered with the intent to progress development of our arts and cultural capacity within the region.

The Fringe in Mount Gambier Festival delivered a combination of open-access and curated activities during the feature weekend on 23 & 24 March 2018. The extended program offered throughout the period 16 March 2018 to 2 April 2018 delivered by venue operators and businesses was well supported and reflects an emerging growth within the local venue operators and businesses to participate in a unique cultural event.


Included in the program were 24 performing arts events, 6 visual art/film events and 2 literary events that were held in different venue/spaces throughout the City of Mount Gambier. The evaluation undertaken reports that the feature weekend held 23 & 24 March 2018 attracted an approximate audience of 12,500 with 75% of participants residing in Mount Gambier and surrounding areas.




The evaluation also revealed information that can guide the sustainable development of this cultural event and affirms Council's involvement due to strong alignment with the Culture and Heritage Plan and Youth Engagement Strategy.


Collaboration with Adelaide Fringe provides a clear branding advantage that the Fringe in Mount Gambier Festival can leverage from. An area for improvement is for a Mount Gambier call for artists to coincide with the registration opening for artists with Adelaide Fringe. Timing the Fringe in Mount Gambier Festival to coincide with the conclusion of the Adelaide Fringe has proven to be of value and captured artists as they make their way to Melbourne. Earlier planning and refinement of artist and venue registrations will position Mount Gambier on the Fringe circuit as a credible destination.

A survey of Fringe in Mount Gambier Festival participants was undertaken during the feature weekend and provided the following snapshot of what went well and areas for improvement:






















The economic value from the Fringe in Mount Gambier has been reported as beneficial to service businesses, cafes and hotels with 94% of survey respondents stating that they went out for a meal before or after a Fringe in Mount Gambier event – a 25% increase from the 2017 event evaluation results.

Increasing artist participation and audience numbers to Fringe in Mount Gambier Festival, evidenced through evaluation can provide confidence for more businesses to consider supporting future Fringe activities that will attract new and larger audiences to Mount Gambier.

As the experience of the organising committee matures, a sustainable model to support the future of this event is beginning to emerge. It has been clearly identified that earlier planning, funding partners and naming sponsors need to be firmly in place within the first quarter of the financial year. Focus on a collaborative framework that provides an educative component for artists, venues and



businesses will increase local content and build cultural, social and economic capacity within our community.

The 2018 Fringe in Mount Gambier Festival was a locally produced collaboration that delivered on a solid commitment to working with artists, 'bricks and mortar' business and venue operators who were prepared to take a risk in the realm of cultural progression and reap the benefits of sold out performances.

Ongoing support will provide a strong cultural development opportunity that will continue to provide our local artists with a forum to engage and learn from visiting artists in a supported environment.

Conclusion

The collective evaluation and feedback received for the 2018 Fringe in Mount Gambier has been extremely positive. Participation, evaluation and extensive positive media coverage has illustrated that this event has provided more than an economic outcome to attract people to Mount Gambier; it has reached the broader community and demonstrated the value of a collaborative capacity building model.

On the 21st March 2018 the community held a public meeting at the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre to discuss the support for a multi-million dollar indoor pool and sports centre which was attended by over 300 people with up to 400 apologies, mostly due to the short time frame of notice.

From that meeting it was resolved that a steering committee be formed to champion a community engagement process to investigate if indeed council would have sufficient community support to pursue the development of an indoor/outdoor facility.

The group consists of members of the key stakeholders and potential users of the facility including the Mount Gambier and Blue Lake Y Swimming clubs, Aquatic centre, Mount Gambier Netball Association, Mount Gambier & District Tennis Association, Mount Gambier Basketball Association and Pioneers Basketball Club. During their seasons, they represent a combined 3350 weekly members and participants many of which who would attend a facility multiple times for either training or competition.

As part of our role as steering committee, we aimed to engage community support via a petition to support the development of an Indoor/Outdoor Aquatic and Recreation Centre for Mount Gambier and surrounds.

The committee was tasked with a grass roots campaign starting on the 3rd April 2018 to garner 20,000 signatures in 20 days from the community of Mount Gambier and surrounds in support of such a facility with the aim to present to council at their special meeting on 24th April 2018. At the meeting Council would discuss whether to confirm a commitment to submission of an Expression of Interest to gain funding for the project through the Regional Growth Fund to assist with the initial capital costs of construction.

Throughout the past 20 days we have engaged the community through a variety of mediums with strong support from our local media including:

TERMS OF REFERENCE

A Committee of Council Established

pursuant to the provisions of Section 41

of the Local Government Act 1999.

Terms of Reference for the conduct of the business of the Council Regional Sport and Recreation Centre Committee were approved and adopted by the City of Mount Gambier at its meeting held on ## Month 201#.

Regional Sport and Recreation Centre Committee

The Regional Sport and Recreation Centre Committee has been established to:

- provide considered advice to assist Council in decision making on matters associated with the grant application and potential development of a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre.
- conduct and/or assist with stakeholder and community engagement
- assist with advocacy that supports Council's resolved position on the Regional Sport and Recreation Centre.

Regional Sport and Recreation Centre Committee

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1. NAME

1.1 The name of the Council Committee shall be the Regional Sport and Recreation Centre Committee (in these Terms of Reference referred to as "the Committee").

2. INTERPRETATION

For the purpose of these Terms of Reference, unless inconsistent with the subject matter or context: -

2.1 Definitions

- 2.1.1 "Act" means the Local Government Act 1999 and includes all Regulations and Schedules.
- 2.1.2 "Committee" means the Committee of Council established pursuant to 3.
- 2.1.3 "Committee Member" means the persons appointed by the Council pursuant to clause 5.
- 2.1.4 "Commencement Date" means the date on which the Committee is established and becomes operative pursuant to clause 3.2.
- 2.1.5 "Council" means the City of Mount Gambier.
- 2.1.6 "Council Members" means the Elected Members of the Council.
- 2.1.7 "Presiding Member" means the person appointed to that position pursuant to 5.
- 2.1.8 "Observers" means those persons attending any meeting of the Committee of Council, but not having a vote on any matter to be determined by the Committee and not having been appointed as Members.
- 2.1.9 "Singular" includes a reference to the "plural".
- 2.1.10 "Standing Committee" means the Strategic Standing Committee or Operational Standing Committee of the Council.

Any words, phrases or terms used in these Terms of Reference that are defined in the Act shall have the same meaning as are given in the Act.

2.2 Application of Local Government Act

The Committee shall operate and the Terms of Reference shall be interpreted in in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act.

2.3 Notices

All communication to be given to the Committee shall be addressed to: -

3. ESTABLISHMENT

- 3.1 The Regional Sport and Recreation Centre Committee is established under Section 41 of the Local Government Act 1999.
- 3.2 The Committee will be established and become operative from the time a resolution of the Council is passed.
- 3.3 The Committee is established by the Council to provide considered advice to assist decision making on matters associated with the development of a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre.

4. OBJECTIVES

4.1 The Committee is created for the express purpose of providing considered advice to assist Council in decision making on matters associated with the development of a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre.

5. MEMBERSHIP

- 5.1 Membership of the Committee will comprise Elected Members of the Council as determined by resolution of Council in accordance with Council policy guiding appointment to committees.
- 5.2 The Mayor has Ex-Officio membership on this Committee.
- 5.3 City of Mount Gambier Elected Members will serve on the Committee for a term of office determined at the pleasure of Council.
- 5.4 The Committee has the right to co-opt individual members who have special expertise to assist the Committee under its objective. Such co-opted members have the right to attend meetings and participate in discussion but will have no voting rights on the Committee.
- 5.5 The Committee will appoint one of the Committee Members determined by Council as a Presiding Member.
- 5.6 If a Committee Member is absent from 2 or more consecutive meetings of the Committee without an apology accepted by the Council then that Committee Members position shall be considered vacant.
- 5.7 The Council reserves the right not to appoint any nominee, to remove and replace any Committee Member including a co-opted member, or to leave any Committee Member position vacant.

6 CASUAL VACANCIES AND REPLACEMENT REPRESENTATIVES

6.1 The Council may replace any Member on the Committee or fill any casual vacancies, by notifying the Committee the identity of the person proposed to replace the representative or fill the casual vacancy.

7 NO PROXY

7.1 The appointment of a person as proxy for any Member on the Committee is not permissible.

8 **RESIGNATION OF REPRESENTATIVES**

8.1 Any Committee Member may resign from the Committee, but such resignation shall not be effective until the Presiding Member has received written notice to that effect.

9 QUORUM

- 9.1 At all Meetings of the Committee a quorum must be present.
- 9.2 A quorum will be determined by dividing by 2 the number of Members formally appointed to the Committee ignoring any fraction and adding 1 (excluding Mayor as ex-officio).

10 MEETINGS OF THE COMMITTEE

- 10.1 The Committee shall hold ordinary meetings at least monthly as and when determined by the Presiding Member.
- 10.2 No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Committee unless a quorum of Members is present.
- 10.3 The Presiding Member, when physically present, shall preside at all meetings of the Committee and at any other time the Committee shall appoint an Acting Presiding Member who shall preside at that meeting.
- 10.4 Each Member of the Committee including the Presiding Member present at any meeting of the Committee must vote on any matter requiring determination and all decisions shall be decided on a simple majority of votes cast.
- 10.5 Each Member of the Committee including the Presiding Member present at any meeting of the Committee shall have one deliberate vote only.

11 PROCEDURES AT MEETINGS

- 11.1 The procedure to be observed in relation to the conduct of meetings of the Committee is in accordance with Local Government (Procedures at Meetings) Regulations 2013.
- 11.2 In accordance with s89 of the Act, insofar as a procedure is not prescribed by regulation, it shall be as determined by the Council, and insofar as a procedure is not determined by the Council, it shall be as determined by the Committee itself.

12 LIABILITY OF THE COMMITTEE

- 12.1 A liability incurred by the Committee rests against Council.
- 12.2 No liability attaches to a Member of the Committee for an honest act or omission by that Member of the Committee in the performance or discharge, or purported performance or discharge, of the Member's or the Committee's functions or duties.
- 12.3 All members of the committee are bound by the Council Member Code of Conduct as published in accordance with Section 63 of the Act.

13 DELEGATION

13.1 The Committee has no delegation to act with all recommendations of the Committee (and of any Sub-Committees established by the Committee) to be considered by full Council for final decision and resolution.

14 SUB-COMMITTEES

- 14.1 The Committee may establish a Sub-Committee to assist it in a matter directly related to the Committees objectives .
- 14.2 When establishing a Sub-Committee the Committee must set out the Terms of Reference for the subcommittee.
- 14.3 The Committee may appoint to a Sub-Committee Council Members who are not members of the Committee, Council Officers and members of the public with skills or expertise in a field relevant to the matters which the Sub-committee is established to assist with.
- 14.4 A Sub-Committee established in accordance with this clause will report to the Committee and will have the same meeting notice, minute keeping and procedural obligations as the Committee as defined in the Act.
- 14.5 If a Sub-Committee Member is absent from 2 or more consecutive meetings of the Sub-Committee without an apology accepted by the Committee and Council then that Sub-Committee Members position shall be considered vacant.
- 14.6 If a Sub-Committee established under this Clause 14 fails to achieve quorum on 2 consecutive occasions then the Sub-Committee will be considered to be in recess and the Chief Executive Officer is to present a report to the Committee for consideration.

15 MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE

- 15.1 The CEO or his appointee must cause minutes to be kept of the proceedings of the Committee.
- 15.2 Minutes of the Committee shall be available to all Members of the Committee, Council and the public.
- 15.3 The Minutes of the proceedings of a meeting are to comply with the requirements of the Act.

- 15.4 Minutes of the Committee Meeting shall be submitted for confirmation at the next meeting of the Committee and if confirmed, shall be signed by the Presiding Member or other person presiding at the subsequent meeting.
- 15.5 Minutes of the Committee Meeting and any recommendations (including the minutes and recommendations of any Sub-Committee established by the Committee) shall be submitted to Council and shall be of no effect until endorsed as a resolution of Council.

16 AMENDMENTS TO TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 16.1 It will be lawful for the Council by resolution to revoke, vary or add to any of the provisions of these Terms of Reference at its own discretion within the parameters of the Act and any other relevant legislation.
- 16.2 Notwithstanding 16.1 hereof before the Council resolves to revoke, vary or add to any of the provisions of these Terms of Reference it may but will be under no obligation to obtain the opinion of the Committee.

17 INTERPRETATION OF TERMS OF REFERENCE

17.1 Should there be any dispute as to the definition and/or interpretation of these Terms of Reference, or any part thereof or any irregularities whatsoever that are unable to be resolved by the Presiding Member then the Council shall determine the dispute and the decision of the Council shall be final and binding.

18 WINDING UP

18.1 The Council may cease the operation of the Committee and the Committee may make such recommendation to the Council on the completion of its function.

Dear Sir Funding Application for Limestone Coast Opera Inc.

As you know, Limestone Coast Opera Inc. has just completed its 2018 season in Mount Gambier. This year, LCO instituted a National Aria Competition, which was run in conjuction with the annual Gala Concert, which showcased Australian born soprano Michelle Buscemi and international stars, Mattia Campetti, and Giancarlo Monsalve. The concert was accompanied by the Melbourne Opera Orchestra under the baton of Greg Hocking AM.

During the week of 5th– 10th March 2018, the inaugural LCO Aria Competition was conducted by way of audition, training, and masterclasses provided to 20 finalists. Finalists were selected from over 60 applicants Australia wide. On Sunday, an excellent concert was held in which the eight finalists sang, in competition.

The concept of a National Aria Competition being run in Mount Gambier was extremely well received by all of the international attendees, all of the competitors who attended, and the Mount Gambier public. So much so, that there is talk of the competition being extended to encourage upwards of 200 entrants to apply next year, with semi-finals and training and masterclasses to be held for over 100 competitors in Mount Gambier. LCO has also had interest expressed from overseas for competitors to attend and enter the competition, and we hope that this will be on our agenda in future years.

LCO needs to expand its funding to accommodate the concert and competition into the future. For this reason, we are requesting funding from City of Mount Gambier, in the sum of \$25,000. This is an increase in funding previously granted to Limestone Coast Opera. We are requesting therefore funding of \$25,000 for the 2018/19 year to continue the presentation of the gala concert and National Aria competition and in return, offer City of Mount Gambier naming rights for the Competition, so it will be known as;

"Limestone Coast Opera Inc/City of Mount Gambier Aria Competition.

Sponsorship Program Overview

Tier 1 Sponsorship - Up to \$2000

Funding provided to events held within the City of Mount Gambier that meets the aims of Council's Sponsorship Program and supports the Community Plan.

Tier 2 Sponsorship - Over \$2000

Funding provided to major/significant events held within the City of Mount Gambier that meet the aims of Council's Sponsorship Program and supports the Community Plan. The event must also attract substantial economic benefit and visitation to the City of Mount Gambier and include strategic and targeted marketing.

Which category should I apply for?

All applicants should apply under the Tier 1 Sponsorship, unless it can be proved that the proposed event will:

- attract substantial visitation to the City
- deliver substantial and measurable economic benefit to the City
- incorporate strategic and targeted marketing practices in its planning and implementation
- The event being held is that of State, National or International significance.

NOTE unsuccessful Tier 2 sponsorship applications are automatically considered under Tier 1 Sponsorship.

Aims of the Sponsorship Program

The aims of the City of Mount Gambier's Event Sponsorship Program are to support the four pillars of the Community Plan in helping to:

- Support the development of vibrant, creative and innovative events that enhance the economic, social and cultural life of the City of Mount Gambier
- · Increase tourist visitation and deliver measurable economic benefits to the City
- · Facilitate community involvement in events and activities
- Attract new and diverse events to the City of Mount Gambier
- Support events that build and reinforce the unique and positive attributes of the City of Mount Gambier.

Assessment

If funding requested exceeds \$5,000 the application is referred to a committee/ council for consideration. A decision regarding the level of assistance will be considered at the next available Council meeting. A decision will be reached within approximately **two months** of the application being proposed at the Council meeting. Notification of the decision will be made in writing.

Applicant Eligibility Criteria

Before submitting your application, please check that you meet the following eligibility criteria – all boxes must be ticked or your application will not be progressed.

The organisation is an incorporated body or, if not incorporated, is being auspiced by an incorporated body

- The proposed event is covered by a current Public Liability Insurance Policy to the minimum value of \$10,000,000.
- Provide either an Australian Business Number (ABN) or complete the Australian Taxation Office "Statement by a Supplier" form

Addresses the criteria outlined in the Event Sponsorship Guidelines and Application Form

Any sporting organisation must be a registered STARCLUB – for more information visit <u>https://www.recsport.sa.gov.au/starclub/index.php</u> or contact your local STARCLUB Field Officer.

Your proposal is INELIGIBLE for funding if:

- Your proposal is for funding towards the operating costs associated with running an organisation (e.g. salaries, equipment)
- Your proposal is for retrospective funding or funding of budget deficits
- Your proposed event is not open to the general public
- Your organisation has not fulfilled previous sponsorship obligations, including provision of post event evaluation/report and financial acquittal
- Your organisation is not an incorporated body, or your proposal is not auspiced by an incorporated body

If you ticked any of the six boxes above your proposal is ineligible for funding.

Assessment Criteria

1. Brief History:

While holidaying in Lucca, Italy, in 2013, Mount Gambier's Chris Judd by pure chance, met Michelle Buscemi in Lucca town square. Michelle and her partner Mattia Campetti were heavily involved in the Lucca Opera Festival, with Mattia managing the Festival, and both performing as singers. Chris attended performances of the Lucca Opera that season and a lifelong friendship was formed.

Michelle was born in Melbourne, Australia, studied music here, and has had a distinguished performance career as an operatic soprano. Michelle's biography can be found here: https://www.operamusica.com/artist/michelle-buscemi/#biography

Mattia is an Italian baritone, who is related to the great Italian composer, Giacomo Puccini, and has managed the Lucca Opera Festival from Puccini's home town for some years. Mattia is also an artist representative through IMG Artists. Mattia's CV can be found here:

1.1 Concerts in Mount Gambier:

As Michelle visits her parents in Melbourne annually, combining holiday with performances throughout Australia and New Zealand, Chris, Mattia and Michelle decided to hold a concert in Mt Gambier in 2014. This first concert was a success, and it has now been presented annually, to acclaim.

1.2 The 2018 Concert program:

In 2018, with the introduction of the Limestone Coast Opera Aria Competition, Limestone Coast Opera, at Mattias' suggestion, decided to support Mattia, Michelle and Giancarlo Monsalve in concert with the Melbourne Opera Orchestra, which has a long a distinguished history of Opera production in Australia and overseas.

The 42 person orchestra, conducted by Greg Hocking AM, provided the backing for the Concert program, and its support was a point of difference from previous accompanied concerts.

Extension of the Concert Program: Education through Vocal coaching: Training & "Masterclass" Programs:

In the second year of presentation of their International Concert, Michelle and Mattia introduced Mount Gambier to Gary Nardella, an operatic tenor and voice coach. In addition to presenting their concert, Michelle and Mattia, with Gary's help, conducted a series of singing training classes in Mount Gambier. Singers from the region and from Melbourne particularly, enrolled and took advantage of the skills and training Michelle, Mattia and Gary offered. These classes were held in the week prior to the Concert presentation. Utilization of these classes has grown basically through word of mouth.

2.1 Specialised Training:

Through Sue Charlton AM at OneStop Paediatric, it was discovered that Gary Nardella also extended his skills to special vocal training for disabled children. Sessions conducted through OneStop, Gordon Education Centre and at Naracoorte by Gary have been highly successful.

(For example, in the annexures Attached find testimonials of the success of Gary's Special Training co-ordinated in the Limestone Coast by Limestone Coast Opera Inc. Also see article published in Naracoorte Herald acclaiming the Limestone Coast Opera program:

This training work is presented outside the usual concert season, and has been conducted twice yearly for the last 2 years. Limestone Coast Opera, with private payment contributions, has funded Gary's expert training programs. Limestone Coast Opera has funded those unable to bear the cost of the tuition.

2.2 Private Training Sessions:

Michelle, Mattia and Gary conducted private training sessions for local singers, which has been funded by private subscription and Limestone Coast Opera funding.

As a result of 3 successful stage concerts, and with the gradual acceptance of the training program, Michelle and Mattia spoke passionately about forming an ongoing relationship with the Mount Gambier community, and extending the Concert program to increase training and instituting a National Aria Competition.

3. Inaugural Limestone Coast Opera Italian Aria Competition:

Limestone Coast Opera Inc was incorporated in 2016, and presented the first programs under its banner in 2017. With the impetus building through Gary's training programs, it was proposed by Michelle, Mattia and Gary that Limestone Coast Opera promote a National Aria Competition. As a point of difference for the competition, Michelle and Mattia proposed, as part of the prizes to be offered;

- That the Competition incorporate an element of scholarship;
- That there be a cash component to the prizes;
- That there be a return air fare component to the prizes;
- That there be a training component to the auditioning of applicants;
- That there be a tuition and training element to the prizes, with tuition offered by Lucca Opera, and the Belcanto Academy associated with the Martina Franca Opera Festival in Italy.
- That a program of introduction for the winners to Opera houses in Italy and Europe, be provided through Mattia Campetti's connections in IMG opera management.

Such an ambitious Aria Competition would seek to rival most other competitions in Australia, and would provide ongoing tuition to the winners. As an element of the program, winners would need to commit to Limestone Coast Opera into the future.

Limestone Coast Opera appointed Gary Nardella as its first Artistic Director in charge of the inaugural Limestone Coast Opera Italian Aria Competition. Michelle and Mattia were consulted at each step of the way. Our main purpose was to provide opportunity for singers to develop their skills, through competition, and to provide scholarships to the winners.

Limestone Coast Opera Board believed that Mount Gambier, and the Limestone Coast community, could fulfil the function of hosts for the competition, and provide a Gala Concert to highlight operatic aria as a fine art form.

Advertisements were placed with every opera school, opera company and with many singing tutors throughout Australia. For the first competition, some 60 entrants applied, with auditions conducted in Sydney, Brisbane, Melbourne and Adelaide, and also by video submission. For the first finals, 20 applicants were chosen to compete in a competitive training environment in Mount Gambier, from 6th-8th March 2018. The final auditions were conducted at the Baptist Church, Mount Gambier. Announcement of Aria Finalists was made on Thursday evening, with final training for the Aria Concert conducted on Friday 9th March in the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre.

The Final Training session was open to the public. Schools were invited to attend, and classes from local schools attended the final training session.

(Constructive comments were received from Schools, a sample is included in the Annexures.) Schools music teachers were complimentary, and Limestone Cast Opera intends to work hard to have more Limestone Coast schools attend and learn from the training provided to the Finalists.

3.1 Limestone Coast Opera Aria Finalists in Competition:

The Finalists competed in Concert on Sunday, 11th March. The theatre was, in the circumstances, well patronised, with approximately 250 people altogether in attendance. The competitors each sang two arias, one prescribed by the Judging Panel, and one of their own choice.

The Panel was headed by Alberto Triola, from Italy.

Jessica Harper, a soprano from Sydney, was our Inaugural Winner. Jessica is aged 27, and has already made arrangements to attend Italy and attend the training and tuition which is part of the Aria prize.

Stephen Marsh, a young baritone from Melbourne, secured second place. Stephen is associated with the Melbourne Opera Company.

Encouragement awards were given to Rachael Birthisel and Tessa Hayward.

Two Limestone Coast entrants (Grace Bawden and Andrew Lees) made the final 20, and were enthusiastic about the competition, the training and tuition received during the week. Their support emails are in the annexures.

The concert for the awards was enthusiastically received by the audience. Local choirs from Mount Gambier, Naracoorte, and Millicent sang on the day, and international pianist, Stefano Teani played while the Jury was deliberating.

All Finalists hailed the competition as a complete success, and have indicated their support for the competition. Most of the finalists who did not make the winners list said they would be back next year, and would advocate for the Limestone Coast Opera Aria Competition.

At this first event, Limestone Coast Opera has attracted over extra 200 people to Mt Gambier for the week leading to the Aria Competition. This comprises;

Most of the competitors were billeted in Mount Gambier, but some chose to use motel accommodation. All visitors used restaurant and other facilities tourists use in Mt Gambier. All internationals commented favourably on Mount Gambier, and the facilities offered by the City.

6. Economic Benefit of the Limestone Coast Opera events:

- 6.1 It is difficult to judge the economic impact of a nascent event such as the Limestone Coast Opera Aria Competition. At this first event, we believe the Long Weekend impacted against the success of the competition. Nevertheless, there was excellent support from those who attended for the week long auditions and training phase.
- 6.2 RDALC Modelling: In a recent submission made to Building Better Regions Fund, the RDALC, using its economic impact modelling tool, estimated the potential economic benefit to Mount Gambier of the Limestone Coast Opera week long competition, training programs and master-classes, plus attendances are concerts (estimated then to be supported by up to 600 attendees) to be in excess of \$800,000.
- 6.3 Limestone Coast Opera believes that it can maximise impact and increase the regional economic benefit by modifying some of its programming for the auditioning process.
- 6.4 Aria Competition expansion:
 - It is our intention to work to have the competition expanded to ensure ALL entrants MUST come to Mt Gambier to audition and participate. Currently,

the judges (Gary Nardella & Michelle Buscemi) have arranged auditions in each state, and have attended personally to conduct auditions.

- Limestone Coast Opera believes the Aria Competition will attract a minimum of 150 entrants in 2019 plus supporters, for the week of the competition. This will be a significant input into the community, and will more likely achieve the economic benefit projections and targets set out above.
- Limestone Coast Opera would anticipate that for the week of competition at least 500 people would come to Mt Gambier. This, we hope would ensure full houses for both the Gala Concert and the Aria Competition concert.
- Limestone Coast Opera needs to invest in promoting the Aria Competition as a full week of audition, training and Masterclass to achieve the above.
- Limestone Coast Opera will also invest in the possibility of International competitors attending for the Masterclass sessions only, with the Aria Competition only available for Australian artists.
- Seed funding to expand the competition will ensure greater attendances, and greater economic impact for the Limestone Coast opera Aria Competition week.

7. Arts & Cultural Benefits: Future of the Limestone Coast Opera Aria Competition & Concert:

Limestone Coast Opera Inc. views the Aria Competition as an entirely viable future event to be hosted in Mt Gambier. Feedback from:

Limestone Coast Opera Inc has run the first event on a very tight shoestring, but we believe there is an Australia wide need for the kind of support we wish to provide for young singers in this country. We wish to utilise the relationship built up with Lucca Opera, Martina Franca Opera Festival, Melbourne Opera Orchestra, Greg Hocking AM, and Michelle, Mattia and Gary to build the Limestone Coast Opera Aria Competition into a nationally recognised competition.

By expanding the audition and training package associated with the Aria Competition, a wider audience will be attracted to Mt Gambier.

Limestone Coast Opera intends to involve schools and wider community music and singing groups to participate in the events. Schools have shown a positive response to this year's rehearsals. Limestone Coast Opera intends to build on that.

8. Limestone Coast Opera Inc. Principal Aims and needs:

- 8.1 Limestone Coast Opera Inc. has three principal aims in presenting and developing its programs into the future:
 - 1. To provide diverse and excellent voice training programs in the Limestone Coast for
 - a. young singers
 - b. school groups
 - c. private singers
 - d. disabled persons

and to enable those groups and individuals to reach their full potential.

- 2. To provide a platform for a series of scholarships, tuition and training programs with an international exposure to assist young Australian singers to reach their full potential.
- 3. To provide and present a wider diverse cultural experience to the Limestone Coast community through presenting world class Operatic concerts Limestone Coast community.

8.2 What we need:

1. Support from the Local Community:

- Limestone Coast Opera programs have been progressively better advertised and acclaimed in the region as a worthwhile program;
- b. Limestone Coast Opera businesses have supported the Inaugural Aria Competition;
- c. Local individuals have supported the Limestone Coast Opera Aria Competition with in-kind support, support of the competitors, support for the judges and coaches and their teams.
- d. Support of the concerts, both Saturday evening, and Sunday, were at reasonable levels this year, indicating an increasing support of the Limestone Coast Opera events.
- e. The community has expressed a willingness to contribute expand and improve the Limestone Coast Opera Inc programs

2. Limestone Coast Opera Inc. needs to build on and develop International relationships:

- Limestone Coast Opera has built a significant relationship with Lucca Opera, Michelle and Mattia.
- b. The first Limestone coast Opera Aria Competition has provided a further significant International connection through International Opera stage producer, Alberto Triola. Mr Triola waxed lyrical about Mount Gambier, and insisted he return to produce an Opera in the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre!
- c. International recognition: With the Italian opera support of Alberto Trioa, Mattia and Michelle, we already have the *Italian Connection*. However, Chinese-born competitor in the Aria Competition, baritone Qi Haotin, commented that Opera was gaining recognition fast in China, and that he would promote the Limestone Coast Opera Aria Award in China when visiting this year. He expected interest from China when they know about this award.
- d. In 2018, we had inquiry from New Zealand and the Pacific Islands, but restricted entrants in the Aria Awards to Australian nationals with residential status.

3. Limestone coast Opera Inc. needs funding to implement our programs:

- a. Limestone Coast Opera is developing its budgets for 2019.
- b. Arts funding is at a premium, but we recognise that we cannot rely on funding from any Government/Arts related source. To obtain such funding is almost a bonus.
- c. Business support is, at the lower levels of sponsorship, difficult to raise above the levels we have sourced in 2018.
- d. We need to attract a Major Sponsor for the Aria competition to make it a full success. The Competition next year will be recognised as one of the best in Australia.
- e. Limestone Coast Opera is putting together a package to attract Major Sponsorship.

4. We need expert assistance to identify funders, funding sources:

- a. Limestone Coast Opera has sought assistance from experts to provide advice on funding applications, and finance available for Limestone Coast Opera programs.
- b. **Employment:** Limestone Coast Opera wishes to appoint a part time **Executive Officer** to provide essential service to the Board in the areas of relationship building, Arts Grants and funding, event co-ordination. We need to raise \$25,000.00 to offer part time executive work required by the Board.
- c. Local Councils can provide us with assistance in this area.

5. We need expert and targeting advocacy to assist us to build our programs:

- **a.** Local Councils can provide targeted advocacy for Limestone Coast Opera and its future programs.
- **b.** Assistance to identify potential Government, semi Government and alternative sources of funding and support would be vital.
- c. Experience in advocating for Limestone Coast Opera programs would be appreciated.

6. A strong Board:

- a. Currently, our Board is a small group, and comprises
 - i. Bill DeGaris, Chair
 - ii. Chris Judd.
 - iii. Lynette Martin OAM
 - iv. Erika Vickery OAM
 - v. Sandra Morello.
- b. The Board is seeking to invite 2 further members to add strength to our financial management, and to add an Executive Officer/Secretarial role.
- c. Limestone Coast Opera has applied for funding from Building Better Regions Fund for the purpose of building a stronger corporate entity, with funding sought for strategic planning, corporate governance planning, and executive/financial planning.
- d. Limestone Coast Opera wished to appoint a part-time Executive Officer, as set out in 7.4 above.

Projected Programs to cover proposed deficit:

- Major sponsorship:
 - Limestone Coast Opera Board intends to launch a campaign for a Major Sponsor NOW, early in the 2018/19 year.
 - o 12 month Gold Sponsorship is to be pitched at \$20,000 to \$25,000.
 - 12 month Silver Sponsorship is to be pitched at \$10,000
 - o 12 month Business sponsorships will be valued at \$5,000, \$2,500, \$1,250.
 - We cannot budget these until we have indications of support.
 - o Current Sponsors, have, in the main, indicated ongoing support.
 - o Sponsors for 2018 year have only had 3 months involvement.

Patronage:

- o Limestone coast Opera Board is looking to institute 2 lines of patronage:
 - Personal patronage
 - "Friends" of Limestone Coast Opera patronage.
 - Friends of Limestone coast Opera was launched late in the current season.
 - We had small take up of Friends, but did not push the program, as we started so late in 2018

Working Capital:

- Limestone Coast Opera will start the 2019 year with almost no "working capital."
- Income streams will arise with sponsorships being paid.
- Budgets will allow for first sponsorship payments to be made in Sept 2019
- Initial working capital of \$25,000 would be well spent in developing programs, developing partnerships and strengthening the Limestone Coast Opera programs for 2019 by bringing ALL auditions, and all competition to Mt Gambier for the week of the Aria Competition and Gala Concert.
- Limestone Coast Opera wishes to appoint an Executive Officer immediately to a
 position which will concentrate on the areas set out in the Budget papers for that
 purpose.

Executive Officer:

- With funding support, Limestone Coast Opera wishes to immediately appoint a part time executive officer experienced in Arts Grants, and event funding/management.
- We envisage employing a part time person initially, at 15 hours per week, at approximately \$400 per week.
- Limestone Coast Opera requires executive support as outlined above, and will
 provide secretarial support through its own resources.

10. Suggested Major Sponsorship:

Limestone Coast Opera Suggests that its events fit into Major Categories of Council's ongoing focus activities including:

- Development of Arts and Culture in the City of Mount Gambier, and in the wider Limestone Coast Area;
- Economic benefits: to the City of Mount Gambier with a Major National Arts Event developing into the future;
- Education benefits: Delivery of training and tuition to the Region, and to Mt Gambier schools and music schools, which will be expanded and developed.
- Limestone Coast Opera requests City of Mount Gambier consider funding of \$25,000 to Limestone Coast Opera to allow Limestone Coast Opera to develop its Aria competition, Concert delivery programs, and its educational programs into Mount Gambier and the Limestone Coast.
- Limestone Coast Opera suggests that the City of Mt Gambier become a Major Sponsor of Limestone Coast Opera and that the Major Award of the 2019 Limestone Coast Opera Aria Competition be re-named:



Fletcher awaits sentencing

assume it was you, I take great offence to that, Magistrate White said.

"I am still deciding whether that is contempt of court, but that is another matter." Facing a \$30,000 dollar fine for each of the 19

charges Fletcher was found guilty of, Magistrate White stated "making the defendant pay all those

Magistrate White suggested ordering 300 hours of community service may be a suitable punishment. The prosecution said it was difficult to measure

the seriousness of the conduct, due to the new "Well he had several warnings at the very least,"

Magistrate White said.

The prosecution agreed with the statement and also pointed out that Fletcher has shown no remorse during proceedings.

Magistrate White asked the defendant to point out any personal circumstances he wanted to put forward and asked if there was any reason he would not be able to complete community service.

"If I am ordered to do community service, I will force myself to leave the house and do it," Fletcher

said. "I am going to sit down and you're going to tell me what to do next."

After indicating there would be intervention orders against three people, he offered Fletcher the opportunity to seek legal advice about them. Sentencing was adjourned for five weeks to allow

Opera thrives in regional South Australia city with new competition and can-do attitude

Big cities, Italian accents and world-famous theatres are the first things most people associate with opera.

But a regional competition in South Australia's south-east is proving the ancient art form can fit just as well into country life.

The Limestone Coast and Lucca Operas' National Aria Awards, taking place in Mount Gambier this week, are believed to be the first of their kind held in regional Australia.

Limestone Coast Opera artistic director Gary Nardella said while there initially had been some challenges organising the event in the small city, the community's enthusiasm had allowed it to thrive.

"We thought logistically it might be a bit tricky to get everyone here, but because we've had such an amazing team the coordination has just worked," he said.

"It's the community that's made this destination ideal for what we're trying to set up. The support that they've given us is incredible."

Singers inspire community

The inaugural competition is part of the Limestone Coast Opera's week-long Festival of Voice, which has been running for four years.

After auditioning 50 singers from around Australia, the organisers chose 20 semi-finalists to come to Mount Gambier and perform in the competition final on Sunday.

First prize includes a place to study at the Bel Canto Academy, as well as trips to Lucca and the Martina Franca Opera Festival in Italy.

"The idea is that the community can come and watch and see how we work with singers and be inspired," Mr Nardella said.

"It invites the person inside a world which they've only seen from the outside."

Moving beyond the 'five big theatres'

International judge Mattia Campetti, who is the manager of the Lucca Opera Group in Tuscany, said career options were limited to opera singers in Australia as a whole, and even more so in regional areas.

"Overseas, every 50 kilometres there is a theatre. Here we have more or less five big theatres in the country," he said.

"All the opera life is mostly around Europe and so if you want to live doing this job, you have to go there."

He hoped to open up more pathways for Australian singers through his involvement in the festival.

"What we are doing is to create this very strong connection between Australia and Italy because Italy is the homeland of opera," he said.

Semi-finalist Cara Gooding, who grew up in the Limestone Coast region, said the competition was a "crazy opportunity".

"This is something you would definitely travel overseas to participate in. You wouldn't think it would be here in this small [city]," she said.

"The prize would definitely be a kickstart. Whoever wins it, it would honestly be amazing for them."

Scope for more regional events

Mr Nardella said contrary to many people's expectations, the regional city of Mount Gambier was more accommodating of his vision than most capital cities.

"It was like the barriers were taken down and people were coming in to try and help and problem-solve and make things happen, which was unique," he said.

"In the big cities there's a lot of obstacles and people find the impossible daunting. This community has just overcome them and it's been able to happen on such a big scale."

Mount Gambier has a population of about 27,000 people and an established local music scene as the home of the James Morrison Academy of Music.

But Mr Nardella said he believed there were many other regional locations where similar events could succeed.

"If we can do it, they can do it. And if more regional areas would do it, I'd be delighted," he said.

"I would love to see this spread to give more singers a platform and inspire other musicians in regional areas to live the dream."

Federal Police crack down on 'ice'

MEMBER for Barker Tony Pasin has welcomed news this week of a major methamphetamine bust in Adelaide.

Law enforcement authorities, led by Australian Federal Police, prevented more than 300kg of ice from hit-ting the streets in South Australia, which had the potential to impact

regional communities. Mr Pasin said the Federal Government was taking action to stop the scourge of ice in regional Australia.

"I understand that regional communities are often the hardest hit when it comes to ice abuse and addiction," Mr Pasin said. "This issue is a huge

acern to many local communities in Barker.

"That's why the Federal Government is tackling the supply of methamphetamine through increased international cooperation, better intelligence sharing and stronger controls over precursor chemicals to prevent ice from reaching our shores

This latest seizure clearly demonstrates the governement's targeted investments are putting a major dent into the ice epidemic in regional communities.

"But law enforcement is only one facet of a very comprehensive strategy at the federal level." The Federal Government

is investing almost \$300m as part of the national ice action strategy to combat illicit drug use, through better treatment, after care and education.

"This includes grassroots programs in local communities such as local drug action teams and an extension of the "good sports" program in regional sporting clubs to develop local strategies to prevent substance abuse in our local communities, Mr Pasin said.



Peek behind the curtains

Production opportunities open for Limestone Coast talent

AWARD-WINNING South East choreographer Lewis Major is creating a new outdoor work, Losers, along with delivering the South Australian premiere of Shaun Parker's award winning Trolleys as part of the Mount Gambier Fringe.

Expressions of interest are being sought from dancers, composers and producers to get involved in the exciting projects, produced by Lewis Major Productions, in partnership with Country Arts SA and

Mount Gambier City Council.

Growing up in the rural South East, Lewis is all too aware of the barriers that sometimes exist between regional audiences and high quality art performances.

As such, the project includes a commitment to providing inclusive opportunities for local young people to be involved in the development, rehearsal and delivery of the two performances.

Losers is part dance, part

ballet, part outdoor spectacle, while Trolleys is a highly physical, humorous outdoor performance featuring contemporary dance, acrobatics and street dance.

Chosen dancers will be required to shadow the creation period of Losers between March 19 and 24 by taking daily class with dancers each morning, being involved in rehearsals and performing in the work on March 24.

Composers will similarly work with composer James Brown to undertake a mentorship where they will explore how music for live performance is created in real time by working with the dancers in-studio and producers will have the opportunity to learn what it takes to deliver a live performance work, from rehearsal room to stage.

Fringe converges on city centre

Festival offers something for everyone with wide range of entertainment

THE city streets will be filled with blue this weekend when the "Fringe" lands in Mount Gambier, providing a wide-range of entertainment for the community to enjoy.

Whether you want to have a laugh at comedians, be amazed by cabaret performers or listen to music from quality musicians, there will be something for everyone when a packed weekend full of events kicks off tomorrow evening.

Tomorrow night's "Lift-off Street Party" is expected to attract hundreds of people to the heart of Mount Gambier as roving artists and performers bring the Fringe party to the Blue Lake city.

Mount Gambier's own Lewis Major - an award-winning Australian choreographer - is one man who is getting back to his grassroots by bringing two different shows to the region for the festival.

"It's been a normal trajectory, New York to London to Paris and back to Mount Gambier and I am really excited to be back in my home town," Lewis said.

"I will deliver two performances - Losers and Trolleys - which will involve a range of local people and also bring in choreographers from the outside."

Losers is a simple 15-minute

piece that will premiere at the Mount Gambier Fringe, which Lewis said he has had great fun curating with passionate local performers.

"Losers is all about standing up straight with your shoulders back and facing up to the world, which works well being so close to Anti-Bullying Week," Lewis said. "We originally started off wanting to create an outdoor water slide for the performance, but then we realised it would be the end of March and was likely to be cold, so it did not quite get off the ground, but it's slowly morphed into an exciting new idea."

Previously involved in Fringe festivals in other cities, Lewis

encouraged people in the region to make the most of the range of events on offer during an actionpacked weekend.

"It's great the Fringe has branched out a bit further because growing up there were limited opportunities to engage with live performances here in Mount Gambier, so it is great to have a

number of things on during this festival," he said.

"It is an uncurated arts festival full of free events where anything goes, so you have to expect anything, because anything could happen."

Gavin Clarke is another local man who will return to the Mount Gambier Fringe to collaborate with other artists in a grassroots art initiative "Send ME to the fringe".

Local musician Louise Adams will be curating the performance, which will involved everything from music to dance, visual art, words and comedy.

"Gavin is a really talented artist with many talents and it will be great to see him share his experience and encourage other budding artists to perform," Louise said.

Louise said "Fringe in Mount Gambier" will not only be a great chance to showcase local talent, but also provide entertainment from national acts.

"It is really important for people to get along to the various artists performing this weekend and show them how much we enjoy having this event in Mount Gambier," Louise said.

"We want to make 'Fringe in Mount Gambier' our own and hope that people go home having seen something weird, wonderful and amazing.

"Enjoy the free shows and then sit down with your family to pick out a ticketed event to get along to and support the wonderful artists we have attracted to our region."

EDITORIAL

1. Invitation for Expressions of Interest

The City of Mount Gambier invites Expressions of Interest from suitably qualified Architectural firms for the provision of architectural design, documentation and project management for the Mount Gambier Regional Sport and Recreation Centre (the **Services**).

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2. Section B – Conditions of Request for Expressions of Interest Process

2.1 Definitions

In this REOI, the following terms will, unless inconsistent with the context, have the meanings indicated:

- 2.1.1 A reference to a **clause** is a reference to a clause of this REOI.
- 2.1.2 **Closing Date** means the time and date specified in clause 2.4.1 or such later time and date as may be notified in writing to Architectural firms by the Council.
- 2.1.3 **Conforming Expression of Interest** means an Expression of Interest described in clause 5.1.
- 2.1.4 **Expression of Interest** means an Expression of Interest submitted by an Architectural firm pursuant to this REOI.
- 2.1.5 **Expression of Interest Process** means the process for calling, receiving and evaluating Expressions of Interest as proposed in clauses 2.8 and 2.9 of this REOI.
- 2.1.6 **Expressions of Interest Return Schedules** are the forms attached to Section D of this REOI.
- 2.1.7 **Nominated Contact Person** means the person named in clause 3.1.
- 2.1.8 **Non-Conforming Expression of Interest** means an Expression of Interest which does not meet the requirements set out in this REOI and/or the REOI Documents.
- 2.1.9 **Preferred Architectural firm** means the Architectural firm referred to in clause 9.1.
- 2.1.10 **Architectural firm's Representative** means the person nominated by an Architectural firm under clause 3.2.1.
- 2.1.11 **REOI** means this Request for Expressions of Interest set out in the REOI Documents.
- 2.1.12 **REOI Documents** means the documents specified in clause 2.3.
- 2.1.13 **Services** means the services sought to be purchased by the Council pursuant to this REOI.
- 2.1.14 **Project Brief** means the specifications specified in Section D of this REOI.

2.2 Request for Expressions of Interest

The Council seeks Expressions of Interest from Architectural firms for the provision of the Services, which are further described in the REOI Documents.

2.3 **REOI Documents**

The REOI Documents are comprised of:

- 2.3.1 this REOI;
- 2.3.2 Project Brief; and
- 2.3.3 the Expression of Interest Return Schedules (which must be completed by the Architectural firm).

2.4 Electronic Lodgement of Expressions of Interest

- 2.4.1 Expressions of Interest must be lodged electronically via SA Tenders and Contracts before the Closing Time/Date of 12 Noon Friday 01 June 2018 and in accordance with the expression of interest lodgement procedure set out in this clause.
- 2.4.2 Where there is any inconsistency between the lodgement procedure set out on the SA Tenders and Contracts website and those set out in this REOI, this REOI will prevail.
- 2.4.3 Expressions of Interest lodged by any other means or any other email will not be considered.
- 2.4.4 Architectural firms warrant that they have taken all reasonable steps to ensure that their Expressions of Interest are free of viruses or any other matter which would cause harm to the Council's website or systems.
- 2.4.5 Architectural firms acknowledge that it is their sole responsibility to ensure that sufficient time has been allowed for Expression of Interest lodgement, including time that may be required for any problem analysis and resolution prior to the Closing Date.
- 2.4.6 If Architectural firms have any problem uploading their Expression of Interest, they must contact the Nominated Contact Person prior to the Closing Date. Any failure to do so will result in the Expression of Interest being a Non–Conforming Expression of Interest.
- 2.4.7 An Expression of Interest is deemed to have been lodged by the Architectural firm when the Expression of Interest has been received by SA Tenders and Contracts server.

2.5 Late Expressions of Interest

Expressions of Interest received after the Closing Date WILL NOT be considered or accepted.

2.6 Extension of time for the submission of Expressions of Interest

- 2.6.1 The Council may, in its absolute discretion, no less than two business days before the Closing Date, extend the Closing Date by notice in writing to the Architectural firms.
- 2.6.2 An Architectural firm may request the Council to extend the Closing Date for the submission of an Expression of Interest by written application to the Nominated Contact Person.
 - 2.6.2.1 Any such requests must be received by the Nominated Contact Person at least five business days prior to the Closing Date, and must provide sufficient reasons to support the request.
 - 2.6.2.2 It is entirely at the Council's discretion as to whether an extension is granted.

2.7 Expressions of Interest validity period

- 2.7.1 All Expressions of Interest will remain valid for three months after the Closing Date.
- 2.7.2 Once submitted, an Architectural firm cannot withdraw its Expression of Interest without the prior written consent of the Council, unless the Expression of Interest is withdrawn before the Closing Date.

2.8 **Proposed Expression of Interest Process**

Request for Expression of Interest responses will be assessed against a predetermined and documented set of criteria (refer to attachment 2) individually by a panel comprising at least three Council representatives of which one has not been involved in the development of the REOI specification.

2.9 Copying Expressions of Interest

Architectural firms must not use this REOI or the REOI Documents (including any attached technical and other written information supplied by the Council) for any purpose other than to prepare an Expression of Interest. This includes not copying this REOI or the REOI Documents (including any attached technical and other written information supplied by the Council) and providing a copy to any third party not involved in the preparation of an Expression of Interest.

2.10 Proposed timing of Expression of Interest Process

- 3.1.3 The Nominated Contact Person may (but is not obligated to) respond to an Architectural firm's enquiries or requests for information or clarification.
- 3.1.4 If the Council provides any information to an Architectural firm by way of clarification, then the Council reserves the right to provide that information to other Architectural firms.
- 3.1.5 No statement made by the Nominated Contact Person, or any other representative of the Council should be construed as modifying this REOI or any of the REOI Documents, unless confirmed in writing by the Nominated Contact Person.

3.2 Architectural firm's contact person

3.2.1 Architectural firms are required to nominate a person to be the authorised contact person and supply an address for the service of any notices for the purpose of this REOI (Architectural firm's Representative).

3.2.2 All communication with the Architectural firm will be via the Architectural firm's Representative.

3.3 Site/industry briefing

3.3.1 A formal site inspection is not required as part of the REOI process, however prospective Architectural firms are encouraged to familiarise themselves with the site prior to submitting a REOI.

3.4 Architectural firm not to solicit the Council and its employees

The Architectural firm and its representatives must not interfere or attempt to interview or to discuss its Expression of Interest with Councillors or employees of the Council, other than the Nominated Contact Person. The Council reserves the right to reject any Expression of Interest submitted by a Architectural firm which contravenes this clause.

4. Expression of Interest Preparation

4.1 Architectural firms to be informed

Each Architectural firm must, prior to submitting its Expression of Interest, become acquainted with the nature and extent of the Services to be undertaken, and make all necessary examinations, investigations, inspections and deductions.

4.2 Evidence of registration or licensing

Each Architectural firm must (if applicable) be licensed or registered to perform the Services.

4.3 Conflict of interest

Architectural firms must inform Council of any circumstances or relationships which will constitute a conflict or potential conflict of interest if the Architectural firm is successful. If any conflict or potential conflict exists, the Architectural firm must advise how it proposes to address this.

4.4 Use of subcontractors

Where an Architectural firm proposes to use resources from organisations other than the Architectural firm itself, substantial information relating to the contractual arrangements for such resources must be detailed in the Expression of Interest, together with information on the relevant experience of such other organisation.

4.5 **Ombudsman Act**

Architectural firms should be aware that the *Ombudsman Act 1972* (SA) has been amended so that the definition of "administrative act" under that Act

includes an act done in the performance of functions under a contract for services with a Council. That Act also includes powers enabling the Ombudsman to investigate matters in the public interest. The Architectural firm must ensure compliance with all obligations arising under that Act and any other applicable legislation.

4.6 Freedom of Information

Architectural firms should be aware that the *Freedom of Information Act 1991*(SA) (FOI Act) gives members of the public rights to access documents of the Council. The FOI Act promotes openness in governance and accountability of government agencies and confers the public with a legally enforceable right to be given access to documents, including contracts entered into by the Council, except for those contracts or provisions which should be kept confidential for public interest purposes, the preservation of personal privacy or are commercial in confidence.

4.7 Collusion

The Architectural firm must not collude with any other Architectural firms or potential Architectural firms.

4.8 Architectural firm's confidential information

- 4.8.1 Subject to clauses 4.8.2 and 12, the Council will treat as confidential all Expressions of Interest submitted by Architectural firms in connection with this REOI during the process, the evaluation period and any negotiations with preferred Architectural firms.
- 4.8.2 The Council will not be taken to have breached any obligation to keep information provided by Architectural firms confidential to the extent that the information:
 - 4.8.2.1 is disclosed by the Council to its advisers, officers, employees or subcontractors solely in order to conduct the REOI process or to prepare and manage any resultant agreement;
 - 4.8.2.2 is disclosed to the Council's internal management personnel, solely to enable effective management or auditing of the REOI process;
 - 4.8.2.3 is published in the agenda for an open meeting to consider and determine the outcome of the REOI process;
 - 4.8.2.4 is disclosed by the Council to the responsible Minister;
 - 4.8.2.5 is authorised or required by law to be disclosed;

- 4.8.2.6 is in the public domain otherwise than due to a breach of the relevant obligations of confidentiality; or
- 4.8.2.7 is disclosed after the Council has either contracted with a Architectural firm or terminated this REOI process.

4.9 ICAC

Architectural firms acknowledge that if they enter into a contract with the Council they will be considered to be public officers for the purposes of the *Independent Commissioner Against Corruption Act, 2012* (SA) (**ICAC Act**) and will be obliged to comply with the ICAC Act and the Directions and Guidelines issued pursuant to the ICAC Act.

5. **REOI Documents**

5.1 Conforming Expressions of Interest

A Conforming Expression of Interest is an Expression of Interest which meets all of the requirements set out in this REOI and the REOI Documents.

5.2 Non-Conforming Expressions of Interest

The Council is not required to, but may at its sole discretion, consider an incomplete, informal or a Non-Conforming Expression of Interest. Failure to respond to or meet any of the requirements set out in this REOI and the REOI Documents will result in the Expression of Interest being deemed a Non-Conforming Expression of Interest.

5.3 Content of Expressions of Interest

- 5.3.1 Architectural firms are required to complete the Expressions of Interest Return Schedules and submit them to the Council.
- 5.3.2 Architectural firms can also supply any other additional information or documents. The Council may have reference to such additional information or documents in evaluating the Expressions of Interest.
- 5.3.3 If an Architectural firm proposes to provide the Services on a basis different to that envisaged by the REOI Documents (whether for reasons of innovation, efficiency or otherwise) that proposal should be fully documented and justified with the Expression of Interest. The Council does not warrant that any discussion with the Council's Nominated Contact Person prior to the Closing Date in relation to such a proposal will be taken into account in evaluating the Expressions of Interest.

6. Acknowledgement by Architectural firms

Each Architectural firm acknowledges that the Council:

- 6.1 makes no representations and offers no undertakings in issuing this REOI or the REOI Documents;
- 6.2 is not bound to proceed to a tender or select tender process or to execute a contract with any party in respect of the Services;
- 6.3 may require one or more Architectural firms (but is not obliged to require all) to supply further information and/or attend a conference or interview;
- 6.4 may require one or more Architectural firms (but is not obliged to require all) to make presentation(s);
- 6.5 may undertake 'due diligence' checks on any Architectural firm, including, but not limited to, verifying references and/or referees, and undertaking company searches and credit checks;
- 6.6 will not be responsible for any costs or expenses incurred by the Architectural firm arising in any way from the preparation and submission of its Expression of Interest;
- 6.7 accepts no responsibility for a Architectural firm misunderstanding or failing to respond correctly to this REOI;
- 6.8 will not be liable for or pay any expenses or losses incurred by any party whether in the preparation of an Expression of Interest or prior to the signing of any contract for the Services or otherwise; and
- 6.9 will not be bound by any verbal advice given or information furnished by any member, officer or agent of the Council in respect of the REOI Documents or this REOI, but will be bound only by written advice furnished by the Nominated Contact Person.

7. Council's Rights

The Council reserves the right to:

- 7.1 amend, vary, supplement or terminate this REOI at any time;
- 7.2 accept or reject any Expression of Interest;
- 7.3 negotiate with any service provider on all or any part of the Services to be supplied pursuant to this REOI;
- 7.4 vary the REOI timing and process;

- 7.5 postpone or abandon this REOI;
- 7.6 add or remove any Architectural firm;
- 7.7 accept or reject any Expressions of Interest whether or not they are Conforming Expressions of Interest;
- 7.8 accept all or part of any Expression of Interest;
- 7.9 negotiate or not negotiate with one or more Architectural firms;
- 7.10 discontinue negotiations with any Architectural firm; and
- 7.11 include the Architectural firms' names in Council reports and make them public.

8. Expressions of Interest Evaluation

8.1 Criteria

In assessing the Expressions of Interest, the Council will have regard to, but not necessarily be limited to, the following criteria (not listed in any order of priority):

- 8.1.1 Insurances, accreditations, qualifications, membership of professional bodies;
- 8.1.2 compliance with work health and safety requirements;
- 8.1.3 customer service experience and capacity;
- 8.1.4 the level of risk associated;
- 8.1.5 environmental management systems (if applicable);
- 8.1.6 degree of compliance with the requirements set out in this REOI and the REOI Documents; and
- 8.1.7 such other matters that Council considers relevant, including:
 - 8.1.7.1 details of current and previous relevant experience in the provision of the Services;
 - 8.1.7.2 the provision of any aspect of the Services by subcontractors (if applicable);
 - 8.1.7.3 financial resources;
 - 8.1.7.4 staff resources;

- 8.1.7.5 current and future workload;
- 8.1.7.6 referees' responses;
- 8.1.7.7 improvement and innovation strategies;
- 8.1.7.8 management skills; and
- 8.1.7.9 transition plan (if applicable).

8.2 Use of REOI Documents

The Council may use, retain and copy any information contained in the Expressions of Interest for the evaluation of tenders in any subsequent tender process and for the finalisation of the provisions of any subsequent contract for the Services.

8.3 Debriefing of Architectural firms

If requested, Architectural firms may be debriefed against the Council's evaluation criteria. Architectural firms will not be provided with information concerning other Architectural firms, apart from publicly available information. No comparison with other Expressions of Interest will be made.

9. Acceptance of Expression of Interest

- 9.1 The Council reserves the right to negotiate different terms and conditions in respect of a contract for the Services with any one or more Architectural firms (each a **Preferred Architectural firm**).
- 9.2 The Council and the Preferred Architectural firm may (if required) enter into negotiations for the award and execution of a contract for the Services. No obligations will exist between the Council and the Preferred Architectural firm until the parties have executed a contract for the Services.
- 9.3 If, despite their best endeavours and acting in good faith, the Council and the Preferred Architectural firm are unable to negotiate and agree on the terms of a contract for the Services, the Council reserves the right to negotiate with any other parties, including other Architectural firms, for the provision of the Services.
- 9.4 Each Architectural firm acknowledges and agrees that all intellectual property created by the successful Architectural firm arising out of the provision of the Services belongs to the Council, and the successful Architectural firm must do all reasonable things necessary to assist the Council in the protection and transfer of ownership of the intellectual property resulting from the provision of the Services.

10. Unsuccessful Expressions of Interest

Unsuccessful Architectural firms must, if requested by the Council, return the REOI Documents to the Council, once they have been advised that their Expressions of Interest is unsuccessful.

11. No Legal Requirement

The issue of this REOI or any response to it does not commit, obligate or otherwise create a legal obligation on the Council to purchase the Services from the Architectural firms.

12. Governing Law

- 12.1 This REOI is governed by the law in South Australia.
- 12.2 The parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts in South Australia.

Section C – Project Brief

The City of Mount Gambier is the owner of Olympic Park located in Margaret Street Mount Gambier and proposes to develop a Regional Sport and Recreation Centre on the existing site (subject to securing available future grant funding). A consultant was engaged to develop the initial design concepts (refer to attachment 1) and the City of Mount Gambier has recently submitted an expression of interest application for a Federal Government Regional Growth Fund (round one submission).

A high level of community and stakeholder interest, input and support for an indoor sport and recreation centre has led and been reflected in the development of the funding application and concept design. At this stage the design is preliminary and will require detailed input by various stakeholders. The City of Mount Gambier considers that the development of an indoor sport and recreation centre is a 'once in a lifetime' opportunity and while still ultimately dependent on grants from Federal and State Government, the facility should be designed with capacity for the future, be multipurpose and accommodate the diverse needs of the community. It should also reflect the City as the regional capital for the Limestone Coast and have the capacity to attract events, tourism and new populations to the City.

The indicative total cost for this project including detailed design, all sub-consultancies, construction, fit-out, landscaping and contingency (but excluding land) is \$40M and may be implemented in a phased manner according to the availability of funding.

In the event that the City of Mount Gambier's expression of interest application does not find favour, the proposed development work will become an investment placing Council in a strong position for any future opportunities for funding.

The primary objective of this request for expression of interest is to establish a short list of suitably qualified and experienced architectural firms from which the City of Mount Gambier will invite selective tenders to undertake the architectural design, documentation and project management for the Mount Gambier Regional Sport and Recreation Centre. Architectural firms will need to be able to work within specified timeframes and adhere to stakeholder engagement requirements as specified by the City of Mount Gambier.

This request for expression of interest is the first phase of a two-stage process being an open first stage followed by an invited second stage.

Stage One: Request for Expression of Interest

This stage will result in a short-listing of three or more firms as determined by the City of Mount Gambier. Short-listing will be based on the material submitted by the Architectural firm and the completion of the return schedules in section D, with consideration of but not limited to:

- Substantial experience in delivering projects of the scale and complexity similar to this project (combined aquatics and sports facility) with extensive experience in a regional context understanding the risks to service delivery.
- Commitment to the City of Mount Gambier's project and vision.

- The ability to engage with a broad range of stakeholders in developing the design and functionality of the proposed centre with nominated communication strategies.
- Project philosophy, methodology, and approach for undertaking a project of this nature and scope.
- The organisational structure and role of partnerships or joint ventures (if any).
- Resumes of proposed key personnel.

At this stage no pricing for project works is required or will be considered.

Stage Two: Select Invitation to Tender

The Architectural firms short-listed in stage one will be invited to submit a formal tender for a possible phased project approach (which will be dependent on future grant funding). This second stage of the procurement process will involve a presentation / interview with each short-listed firm (anticipated early July 2018) and a site briefing. Pricing will be considered at this tender stage and due to the possible phased project approach Architectural firms will need to provide:

- a) Fixed pricing for intermediate design drawings which need to be completed prior to 30th September 2018 for the City of Mount Gambier's round two submission of the Federal Government Regional Growth Fund;
- b) Fixed pricing for completion of all documentation and detailed drawings for project works to enable the engagement of a building contractor via a tender process (which will only proceed with successful grant funding); and
- c) Fixed pricing for project management for the entire build process.

Through the two stage process, an architectural firm will be selected and engaged with the responsibility to fully design and provide complete and accurate documentation for the project (including the engagement of sub-consultants as required) and to project manage the construction, including the tendering process and contract administration associated with construction. The City of Mount Gambier will consider expressions of interest from suitably qualified lead architects and / or project manages to manage all phases of the project including detailed design.




