Background

This report provides an update on the progress of the Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) focus group, including the key points discussed at a meeting of the group held at Council on Monday 7 May 2018.

Discussion

Mapping of Boandik Country

Findings from further investigation into the development of a map outlining Boandik Country were presented to the focus group for discussion. Whilst the findings reiterated the uncontested positioning of Mount Gambier well within Boandik Country, it also identified limitations of the map as a tool of informing clear boundaries to where Boandik Country starts and finishes.

It was identified that more work was required to develop a map that would be useful in interpretive and educational activities locally.

Signage

It was endorsed at the 19 December 2017 meeting of Council that the proposed signage strategy include Bunganditj, the language of the Boandik, for sites of cultural significance as recommended by the Elders of the Reconciliation Action Plan focus group.

The two stage approach in report AR17/49103 (Attachment 1) was discussed. The focus group agreed to prioritise work with Burrandies and the Boandik Language group to confirm correct language and appropriate design elements to be presented for consideration. This work is to be a collaborative approach that aligns with Councils endorsed concepts for the signage strategy and are to include:

- Welcome/entrance signage
- Locational signage for the Blue Lake, Leg of Mutton Lake and the entrance/grounds of the Valley Lakes.

The focus group further discussed options for the second, interpretative stage of the strategy that Council work with Burrandies and the Boandik Language group to scope a project that may attract funding for the engagement of a consultant or anthropology student to conduct research to assist with collection, curation of and content development for the interpretive signage.

Observation of key dates

Council will acknowledge the following important dates with programmed activity at both the Library and Main Corner/Riddoch Art Gallery:

- National Sorry Day (26 May) Display of part of National Sorry Day speech, educational materials and collection.
- Reconciliation Week (27 May to 3 June) "Don't Keep History a Mystery"
 - 'Ted Talks and Soup' event and themed Bookwell program and Story Time Sessions
 - Exhibition of the Gooch Collection curated to explore the theme.

Membership

It was agreed that a simple communication tool be developed for Elders to approach new members for the RAP working group, with a particular emphasis on young people and representatives from the education sector.



Conclusion

The RAP Focus Group will continue to meet regularly to progress the development of the plan and implement targeted initiatives that are strategically aligned with the direction of Council.

Background

Yerkalalpata - Leading the Way. Progressive development of a Reconciliation Action Plan for the City of Mount Gambier has been underway since 2015 with actions and recommendations regularly reported and endorsed by Council via the minutes of the Community Engagement and Social Inclusion subcommittee.

A significant action item identified in the Reconciliation Action Plan is the introduction of Bunganditj, the Language of the Boandik, to public signage when acknowledging and/or referencing sites of cultural significance. Mapping of Boandik country is also an identified action item.

Discussion leading to these actions have included:

- That cultural consideration be given to naming on future City Welcome signage that includes Boandik acknowledgement at the City's key entry points and includes use of the name Berrin (Mount Gambier)
- Boandik recognition signage at key Civic locations and at identified sites of cultural significance
- Opportunities for the extended railway passage between Pick and White Avenues to include a Boandik *cultural* information trail
- Create a Boandik map for use as an education and community reference tool

Discussion

Council have now commenced implementation of a Signage Strategy with the next stage recommended to be the creation of full size concepts for tourist regulatory road signs, pedestrian directional signage and pedestrian interpretive signs.

Concurrent to developing the implementation plan for the Signage Strategy, further consultation was undertaken with the Elders of the Reconciliation Action Plan focus group to seek confirmation of the sites to be recognised as culturally significant, the appropriate naming in Bunganditj language, dreaming story incorporation and the boundaries of Boandik country.

The suggestion from that consultation was for a 3-stage approach as follows:

Stage 1 - Signage for Gateway and Crater Lakes Precinct

Gateway signage to acknowledge that Berrin (Mount Gambier) is on Boandik Country. There are many examples of good recognition signage now available, and new signage has recently gone up in the Coorong.

There was further discussion regarding Bunganditj (the language of the Boandik) incorporation in signage. The Elders identified we should seek clarification from the dictionary and the language reference group at Burrandies for dual naming to occur when referencing key areas of the Craitbul story:

Regionally

- Mount Gambier Berrin
- Mount Muirhead Beleter
- Mount Schank Parreen



Crater Lakes Precinct

- Leg of Mutton Yatton Loo
- The Blue Lake Warwar
- Valley Lake Yart Lambo
- Valley Lake (South) Palon
- Browns Lake Krawerat-wari

Other Sites

• Umpherston's Cave - Balambul

Stage 2 - Stories/Content for interpretative signage

Crater Lakes precinct, the Elders recommend Council start with signage detailing the Craitbul dreaming story, explaining how the craters came to be. Develop a signage trail detailing the unfolding story. A version of the story was written many years ago and it is recommended that this be used as the base.

Following on from the Craitbul story, recommend that there be a focus on Mar the cockatoo and how the swamp country came about.

Stage 3 - Boandik Area Map

Commence work to produce an overlay map recognising the territories and boundaries of Boandik Country. This will be helpful to identify other local Government areas incorporating Boandik country and placement for Welcome to Boandik Country signage in the region.

Following is a high level scheme of key milestones of the proposed Signage Strategy

Aligned with Council's commitment to the Reconciliation Action Plan, integration of the Bunganditj (the language of the Boandik), in the tourist signage implementation strategy proposed in this
