

 - (c) Council authorise the Chief Executive Officer to update the 'Schedule of fees and charges 2021/22' with any externally set statutory fees and charges updates as referenced in the relevant Acts, without needing to return to Council for approval.



TYPE OF REPORT

BACKGROUND

Section 188 of the Local Government Act (the Act) 1999 provides the authority for councils to impose fees and charges. Section 188 further provides that:

- "(6) The Council must keep a list of fees and charges imposed under this section on public display (during ordinary office hours) at the principal office of the Council.
- (7) If a Council fixes a fee or charge under this section, or varies a fee or charge under this section the Council must update the list of fees and charges and take reasonable steps to bring the fee or charge, or the variation of the fee or charge, to the notice of persons who may be affected."

The fees and charges are one of a number of inputs to the Annual Business Plan and Budget (ABP&B).

PROPOSAL

The Council has undertaken an annual review of fees and charges in preparation for the 2021/22 Fees and charges Register and the drafting of the 2021/22 Annual Business Plan and Budget.

In the interest of consistency across the local government sector, the SA Local Government Association (LGA) developed a standard template format (including the treatment of GST) for use by councils when preparing their schedule of fees and charges. The fees and charges review continues to adopt the model format recommended in the LGA guidelines.

The Council's review of fees and charges for 2021/22 has been completed having regard to the provisions of the Act as well as the LGA guidelines.

In completing the review for the 2021/22 financial year, consideration was initially given to:

- The South Australian Local Government Price Index;
- Fees and charges published for the current financial year by a sample of Limestone Coast councils;
- Notification, where received, of increases in the cost of services/utilities for the next financial year;
- Actual movement, where known, in the cost of services/utilities during the current 2020/21 financial year (e.g. utility expenses, fuel expenses);
- A previous Council resolution that 'where practical, Council endeavors to increase fees and charges, on an annual basis, by the ruling consumer price index percentage'.

However, there are a number of fees and charges that are statutory in nature and are not set by the Council. Council will follow the statutory requirements for these fees. Although this is not known at this point in time, these statutory fee changes could potentially include fee increases in some areas. Council records statutory fees and charges on the register to enable staff and members of the public access to a single information source, rather than having to refer to various different Acts.

At the time of preparing the draft fees and charges, the statutory charges for the 2021/22 financial year had not been released by the relevant State Government departments. It is anticipated that updated statutory charges will be known by 31 August 2021, at which point the Schedule of fees and charges – 2021/22 will be updated accordingly.

BACKGROUND

Annual Business Plan and Budget

Under Section 123 of the Local Government Act 1999 (the Act), councils are required to adopt a draft Annual Business Plan (ABP) on an annual basis. Once adopted, the Draft Annual Business Plan is required to be circulated for the purposes of public consultation.

The Local Government Act 1999 Chapter 8, Part 2 Annual Business Plans and Budget, Section 3 (b) states that councils must:

"Follow the relevant steps set out in its public consultation policy, taking into account the requirements of subsection (4)."

Section 123(5) of the Act requires the Council to:

- "Publish in a newspaper circulating within the area of the council and on a website a notice informing the public of the preparation of the draft Annual Business Plan; and
- Consult with its community for at least 21 days on its Annual Business Plan; and
- Invite interested persons to attend a public meeting or a meeting of the council the date of which is to be included in the notice at which members of the public may ask questions and make submissions in relation to the Annual Business Plan.
- That a copy of the draft Annual Business Plan be available at the meeting.
- That a copy of the draft Annual Business Plan be available for inspection (without charge) and purchase (on payment of a fee fixed by the council) at the principal office of the council and on the website at least 21 days before the date of the meeting."

The Council's Policy P195 Community Consultation and Engagement Policy sets out the policy the Council for Community Public Consultation and Engagement under normal circumstances. This Policy affirms Council's commitment to effective, ongoing and timely community engagement as an integral part of local governance and key decision making.

COVID-19 amendments

In accordance with the emergency provisions and recognition of the temporary COVID-19 amendments to the Local Government Act 1999, the regular Community Consultation and Engagement Policy has been amended.

Council Report 'Policy Review - C410 Code of practice for conduct of meetings - holding and participating in meeting by electronic means - Report No. AR20/21246', which re-presents policy provisions and updated Policy C410 Conduct of Meetings to address Member attendance at meetings and informal gatherings by electronic means have been endorsed in line with the changes to the act.

Consequently, the updated 'Community Consultation and Engagement policy April 2020' indicates that "Council will not publish a notice in a newspaper ... regarding a public meeting or a meeting of Council". However, it "will publish a notice inviting interested person to make written submissions within the period stated in the notice (which will not be less than 21 days after the publication of the notice) in relation" to the ABP&B.



Under B. Statutory Requirements to hold public meeting suspended the P195 policy now indicates:

"The Council will not publish a notice in a newspaper circulating in the area of the Council inviting interested persons to attend a public meeting or meeting of the Council in relation to any matter within the scope of Sections 123, 151 or 156 of the Local Government Act 1999 for which public consultation is required under the Local Government Act 1999. The Council will not hold such a public meeting or invite persons to attend a meeting of the Council to ask questions or make submissions on the matter.

The Council will publish a notice in a newspaper circulating in the area of the Council inviting interested persons to make written submissions within the period stated in the notice (which will not be less than 21 days after the publication of the notice) in relation any matter within the scope of Sections 123, 151 or 156 of the Local Government Act 1999 for which public consultation is required under the Local Government Act 1999. The Council will consider the submissions at a meeting of the Council".

Waste Services Charge

The Local Government Act 1999 paragraph 155 introduces a service charge as (1) (b) a prescribed service for 'the collection, treatment or disposal (including by recycling) of waste'

For the City of Mount Gambier this charge is intended to include the expenditure related to:

- Waste collection
- Green waste collection
- Waste Transfer Station
- Re-Use Centre
- Bulky waste collection (if this is not financed in alternative ways)

The Local Government Act 1999 paragraph 151 (1) (c) says that Before a council

"changes the imposition of rates on land by declaring or imposing a separate rate, service rate or service charge on any land,"

The council must (e)

"follow the relevant steps set up in its public consultation policy"

Paragraph 151 (8a) (b) says this

"may be undertaken as part of the public consultation required with respect to the council's draft annual business plan."

Waste Service Charge

There are two proposed changes to the current rating assumptions and directions:

- the introduction of a Waste Service Charge at \$200 per year for FY2022 for all assessments where applicable, including properties where Council applies mandatory or discretionary rebates on the general rates, excluding non-rateable properties.
- the introduction of the principle that the combined General Rates Fixed Charge and the Waste Service Charge will raise approximately 45% of Council's overall rates and charges revenue

FROM THE MAYOR

The Draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget (ABP&B) is a statement of Council's intended program of work and objectives for the upcoming financial year.

The ABP&B outlines how Council plans to achieve its goals and the methods we will implement to monitor and measure performance. It also includes a summary of the revenue and expenditure required to deliver the program, developed within the context of Council's commitment to financial sustainability and long-term financial planning. The impact on rates and implications for ratepayers is also outlined.

This budget continues to ensure that service delivery is maintained while Council oversees the development of its largest ever infrastructure project, the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre. The build at Olympic Park is expected to be completed in Autumn 2022 and I am very excited for the community to have access to this much needed state of the art facility. Wulanda will be a place for all, providing aquatic, sports, cultural, youth, café and creche facilities as well as a convention space for the benefit of the entire community.

I am pleased to share that in recent months Council secured \$800,000 in State Government funding to extend the shared cycling/walking path from Wandilo Road to Wireless Road and install solar lighting along the total length, spanning 11.3 kilometres. Council will match this funding amount dollar for dollar and work on the path is expected to be undertaken within the next year.

To ensure Council's priorities reflect the needs of our community, annual financial planning and budgeting is undertaken with long-term goals in mind. Council continues to review its strategic response to COVID-19 in an ongoing effort to support the community as we move forward to a sustainable recovery. This follows a multi-million-dollar COVID-19 stimulus and recovery allocation provided by Council as part of the 2020/2021 ABP&B.

As of 1 July 2021, Council proposes to implement a Waste Service Charge (WSC) to highlight the cost of waste management on rate notices. It is important to note that this \$200 charge is not an additional cost to most ratepayers, as it is already included within the total General Rate Revenue and will be separated out as an additional line item on your rates notice. Council hopes the WSC will encourage ratepayers to consider their personal environmental impact and the costs associated with waste management and does not intend to raise overall rates and charges associated with the WSC. You can have your say about the proposed WSC as part of the Draft Annual Business Plan and Budget community consultation process. Visit <u>www.haveyoursaymountgambier.com.au</u> for further details.

Key influences on the Draft 2021/2022 ABP&B include:

- The vision outlined in the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan: An inclusive city, where people lead fulfilling lives through the delivery of services and essential infrastructure.
- A focus on economic development including tourism and the development of a strategic plan for the city's tourism assets.
- Continuing investment to promote Mount Gambier as a visitor destination, a regional retail and commercial hub and as a quality destination to host major events and conferences.
- Development of the Mount Gambier Sport, Recreation and Open Space Strategy, informed by community feedback.
- Continuing development of Council's Asset Management Plans, the blueprints we use to maintain our portfolio of assets throughout the city, worth approximately \$247 million.
- Completion of building works on the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre with the support of grant funding from the Commonwealth and State Governments.
- Additional capital works program of approximately \$10.6 million including work on 20 roads as part of the road reconstruction program, the completion of the Pinehall Avenue and O'Leary Road intersection and 12 new footpaths.
- · Maintaining the wide range of community support programs and initiatives, and

Retaining and developing Council's workforce to enable Council to maintain its service delivery.

The Draft 2021/2022 ABP&B shows a budgeted net surplus of \$17.67 million. This includes budgeted amounts received for new assets of \$18.36 million related to State, Federal and additional funding for the construction of the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre. The operating result for the 2021/2022 ABP&B provides for an operating deficit as at 30 June 2022 of \$0.571 million as a result of COVID-19 initiatives undertaken during 2020.

Council will formally consider all feedback provided as part of the Draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget community consultation process which will occur from 19 May until 10 June 2021. The final 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget will be adopted by Council in June 2021.

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OUR CITY

Mount Gambier has a population of 27,433 people (ABS ERP 2020), is centred halfway between (approximately 440 kilometres) the capital cities of Adelaide and Melbourne as South Australia's second largest city. Mount Gambier is the regional centre for the Limestone Coast region of South Australia, the Western District of Victoria and is widely known as the home of Australia's softwood timber industry and the wine regions of Coonawarra and Padthaway. The city services the commercial, retail, health, social, tourism, sporting, arts and cultural needs of a regional population of more than 70,000 people.

Mount Gambier covers 3,388 hectares with a population density of 8.10 persons per hectare. The 2016 Census resident population was 26,276, living in 12,328 dwellings with an average household size of 2.3 persons. This represents an increase in population from 25,773 persons recorded in the 2011 Census.

The majority of City of Mount Gambier residents are employed in the retail and services sectors including health care, financial and social assistance and the manufacturing sector. With a diverse and stable economic base, the Mount Gambier region is one of the most significant contributors to the South Australian economy in both export, local income and tourism. Key industries that contribute to the city and regional economy are:

- Softwood timber industry,
- Visitor economy,
- Health services,
- Agribusiness, and
- Transport and logistics.

A focus for growth is the visitor economy, a diverse and wide-reaching sector that impacts broadly across service and product groups. The growth of this sector impacts on business opportunities from hospitality, to growing existing products and services and providing exciting new opportunities. This sector strongly links to the agribusiness sector, with farm experiences increasingly sought after by international visitors.

Transport and logistics are key employers in Mount Gambier. The city is one hour from Portland's major deep sea port and ensures that Mount Gambier remains a key transport hub. The transport sector remains strong, with growing demand, particularly in the city's forestry sector.



OVERVIEW

The City of Mount Gambier ABP&B is an important part of Council's suite of strategic management plans and integrated planning and budgeting framework. It aligns with:

- · The 2020-2024 Strategic Plan and its strategies, initiatives and projects,
- Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP), and
- The Infrastructure and Asset Management Plans (IAMPs)

to ensure that Council optimises the mix of services, programs, infrastructure and facilities for the benefit of the local community. The draft 2021/2022 budget provides for:

- \$55.8 million in capital expenditure projects. \$10.6 million is drawn from the Council's detailed Asset Management Plans and \$45.2 million from the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre project co-funded with Commonwealth and State grant funding,
- \$0.572 million operating deficit as at 30 June 2021 before the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre funding,
- \$17.67 million net surplus after funding for the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre.

Key initiatives for 2021/2022 are detailed in the budget section of this document. Rates income accounts for approximately 65% of Council's operating income. Council proposes to alter the standard rating policy structure for 2021/2022 to include:

- A fixed charge applicable to every rateable property that will raise approximately 37% of Council's overall general rate revenue,
- A Waste Service Charge (WSC) to separate and highlight the annual individual ratepayer waste component currently absorbed within the General Rates, as per the 'Proposed Rating Structure and Waste Service Charge' Council resolution on 16 February 2021. Further information about the WSC is provided in the rating strategy section of this document and in Appendix C.
- Differential rates based on land use multiplying the capital value supplied by state valuation
 office by the differential rate in the dollar adopted.

BUDGET INFLUENCES

Council operates in a dynamic environment with pressures from economic, operating and political influences. The Draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget includes the following:

- Confirmed grant funding for the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre. Significant resources will be committed to the governance, financial and construction processes for the oversight of the project in the 2021/2022 financial year,
- New strategies aligned to Council's 2020-2024 Strategic Plan,
- · Council's focus on economic development and tourism opportunities, and
- Employee cost increases linked to Enterprise Bargaining Agreements.

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS

Long Term Financial Plan

The development of a Long Term Financial Plan (LTFP) is a requirement of Section 122 (1) of the Local Government Act 1999. The purpose is to translate the vision, objectives and strategies of the Strategic Plan into financial terms and to guide the direction of Council in a financially sustainable manner.



Council's LTFP was adopted in February 2021 and is reviewed regularly (and at a minimum within two years of each Local Government Council election) and acts as a reference point in the formulation of future Annual Business Plans and Budgets.

The LTFP is driven by Council's suite of strategic management plans and includes future estimated revenue and expenditure particularly focusing on the financing and scheduling of major projects, loan indebtedness, rating level, asset replacement/renewal and impact on operating expenditure.

Council's LTFP assumes:

- · Continuation of existing services and infrastructure at current service standards,
- No internal changes to services or investment in new or upgraded assets other than what is already resolved and planned, and
- Construction and operation of the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre.

Council's financial projections over the long term planning horizon are not a prediction of financial position or performance, rather an indication of direction and financial capacity.

The LTFP outlines that Council is meeting its financial obligations and targets over the term of the plan and has the financial capacity to continue to meet the service demands of the community, together with the flexibility to respond to changing circumstances.

The projections indicate that based on current assumptions, Council is in a sound financial position with a favourable outlook over the term of the LTFP.

Financial sustainability

Financial sustainability in local government ensures that each generation pays their way rather than any one generation living off their assets and leaving the responsibility for infrastructure/asset renewal to future generations.

South Australian local government has developed a set of indicators to measure councils' financial sustainability. Financial Sustainability Indicators and their targets are used by the Council as a guide in the LTFP. The principal indicators are derived from Council's audited financial statements being:

- Operating surplus / (deficit),
- Net financial liabilities, and
- Asset renewal funding (or asset sustainability).

The following table presents a comparison of the key financial indicators, including Council's budget targets, to maintain its financial performance.

The financial indicators represent the following:

- Operating surplus / (deficit) ratio expresses the operating surplus (or deficit) as a percentage of general and other rates, net of rebates.
- Net financial liabilities ratio indicates the extent to which net financial liabilities of the Council can be met by Council's total operating revenue. Where the ratio is falling it indicates Council's capacity to meet its financial obligations from operating revenues is strengthening. Where the ratio is increasing it indicates a greater amount of Council's operating revenue is required to service its financial obligations.
- Asset renewal funding ratio (or asset sustainability ratio) indicates whether the Council is
 renewing or replacing existing physical assets at the rate at which they are wearing out. Councils
 with a high ratio are replacing and renewing capital assets at a rate comparable to
 depreciation/wear.

SERVICES

All councils have mandatory responsibilities under the Local Government Act, the Development Act, the Public and Environmental Health Act and other relevant legislation for the provision of services. These include:

- Regulatory activities e.g. maintaining the voters roll, property ownership data and supporting the elected Council body,
- Setting rates, preparing an annual business plan, budget and determining longer-term strategic management plans,
- Management and maintenance of infrastructure including roads, footpaths, parks, public open spaces, street lighting and storm-water drainage,
- · Street cleaning, rubbish collection and recycling,
- · Development planning and control, including building safety assessment,
- · Various environmental health services including food safety, public health,
- Protection of natural resources, and
- Inspectorial services (parking, animal control).

In response to community demands, Council also provides discretionary services and programs including:

- · Libraries and associated facilities and programs,
- The Main Corner Complex and room hire,
- Youth development and programs,
- Economic development,
- Environmental programs,
- Tourism and visitor services,
- · Attracting major events to the city,
- Community events programs,
- Events, sponsorship and grants,
- · Free public Wi-Fi,
- Public parks and gardens,
- Community programs,
- Sporting and recreational facilities,
- Lifelong learning,
- · Community engagement and social inclusion,
- Cemeteries,
- · Advocating on behalf of the community to Federal/State Governments, and
- · Citizenship ceremonies.

In accordance with the LTFP, Council's 2020/2021 Annual Business Plan and Budget will provide for existing service levels to be maintained.

ANNUAL BUSINESS PLAN AND BUDGET

The Draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget proposes that Council will spend a total of \$34.5 million in operating expenditure, including depreciation of \$7.7 million and total capital expenditure of \$55.8 million on the delivery of services and programs, maintenance of assets and development of new or upgraded assets (including \$45.2 million towards the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre).

The provision of services such as the Library, parks and infrastructure maintenance, waste collection and disposal continue to be a significant component of Council's budget.





- Council's rates modelling which is based on the State Valuation Office valuations.


The following graphs show Council's draft budgeted operating income and expenditure for 2021/2022 as a percentage of total income and expenditure respectively:

MEASURING PERFORMANCE

Measuring and monitoring Council's performance is fundamental to ensure specified objectives are achieved and programs and services are delivered to the community.

Council monitors financial performance through a range of financial reports including regular financial statements, quarterly comprehensive budget reviews, quarterly performance against the interim and final audits by Council's appointed external auditors and the presentation of audited financial statements each year as required under the Local Government Act 1999. The financial reports also take into account the principles of financial sustainability adopted by the Council along with the three key financial sustainability indicators.

The Council's Annual Report also provides information on overall performance.

RATING STRATEGY

In 2021/2022 approximately 65% of Council's operating revenue will come from rate revenue. As a result, Council's rating policies and strategies are key components of financial planning.

The 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget includes a 4.5% rate increase in line with the Long Term Financial Plan. External grant funding will be received during the build and commissioning of the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre project. To accommodate and manage the timing of grant income payments and project expenditure, Council has modelled the Long Term Financial Plan to include drawing upon loan facilities through the Local Government Finance Authority.

The following increases in general rate revenue have been applied over recent years:

Valuation method

Capital Value is used as the basis for valuing land within the Council area in common with almost all other South Australian councils. This method values the land and all of the improvements on the land. This valuation method is considered the fairest and most efficient method of distributing the rate responsibility across all ratepayers because:

- It is the most appropriate measure of relative wealth in the community,
- As a measure of wealth, it most closely reflects the property owners' capacity to pay, and
- It equates with the taxation principle that people should contribute to community, social and
 physical infrastructure in accord with their capacity to pay as measured by property wealth.

Other valuation methods available are: site value (value of land only) and annual value (value of the rental potential of property).

Note 1: Property values in the Council Area (as provided by the State Valuation Office) for 2021/2022 financial year are yet to be received therefore comparison to the previous year are unable to be provided at the time this document was prepared.

General Rates

Section 147 of the Local Government Act 1999 provides Council with the power to rate all land within the City of Mount Gambier, except for land specifically exempted, such as Crown Land.

Fixed Charge

Council has determined that a component of the total rate will be a fixed charge on every rateable property. The fixed charge applies to all ratepayers and continues to raise slightly less than one half of total rate revenue (before rebates and remissions) required for the 2021/2022 financial year.

Council's reasons for including a fixed charge component are:

- To be able to deliver a range of services to the community, Council must maintain a range of
 internal support, infrastructure and administrative services. No particular group of ratepayers
 benefit more than any other group of ratepayers by the provision of these services, and
- Council considers it appropriate that all ratepayers contribute equally to the cost of administering Council's services and activities.

Fixed charge comparison

Note 1: Council anticipates that the fixed charge of Council's rating structure will continue to raise approximately 36.5% of Council's overall rate revenue. The fixed rate component will be set by Council.

Proposed Waste Service Charge

The cost associated with waste management including bin collection, waste treatment and disposal is not currently identified on individual City of Mount Gambier rate notices as it is included within Council's 'General Rate Revenue'.

To highlight the cost of waste management, Council proposes to adjust its rating structure to remove the annual individual ratepayer waste component from the General Rates and introduce it as a new separate fixed Waste Service Charge (WSC).

The proposed WSC will be administered in accordance with the Local Government Act 1999 and **will not be an additional cost to most ratepayers**. Council **does not** intend to raise overall rates and charges associated with the WSC.

The proposed WSC is an environmental decision to make waste management costs visible and clear to ratepayers by highlighting the waste fee for each property on the rates notice. Waste management is one of the largest costs to the community and Council wishes to encourage ratepayers to consider their personal environmental impact and the costs associated with waste management.

The proposed WSC is \$200.00 per year and is calculated based on last year's (2019/2020) and this year's (2020/2021) actual and budgeted waste collection, treatment and disposal costs per rateable assessment. The proposed WSC will be charged on the basis of the service being available to a property. It will exclude vacant land and primary production where there is no dwelling on the land.

The proposed separate WSC will establish the framework to allow for flexibility to provide future incentives for ratepayers who demonstrate good waste management. Council will continue to work with the community to provide waste education and awareness programs to encourage waste reduction and recycling to divert rubbish from landfill.

The proposed WSC will be used to cover all waste associated costs. In any year that the total WSC results in a surplus, funds will be accounted for in a specific 'waste' reserve as per the Local Government Act 1999, to be used on waste related services.

The introduction of the WSC has no significant concerns in relation to equity across most rateable assessments within the community. The WSC is a component of the overall rating system and has been structured such that any broader social implications are minimised. By reducing the general rates fixed charge by the amount of the WSC there is no bottom-line impact on most ratepayer assessments.

Council will maintain the existing discretionary rebate assessment process and non-rateable assessments as per our current rating policy. It is noted that current recipients of rebates of less than 100% of their total assessment will experience a proportionate reduction in rebate, attributable to the WSC amount, and recipients of 100% rebates will now incur the WSC amount. Whilst this imposes a modest annual WSC charge on a small number of affected assessments, this is attributable to the actual cost of a service that benefits the relevant property, and the application of this non-rebatable charge reduces the subsidy for that service to those assessments otherwise absorbed by all other ratepayers within the WSC amount and/or or general rates. Further, the application of the WSC ensures that current recipients of the service are contributing toward the total current costs of providing the service including capital/depreciation costs and thus addressing potential burden that could otherwise accrue to future ratepayers as a result of absorption of such costs within general rates.

The calculation of the WSC amount takes into account the actual cost and is also benchmarked against similar public (Council) and private/commercial charges for similar services, and whilst some ratepayers may have a greater or lesser need or use of the service, the WSC amount, considered as part of the overall rating structure, provides an equitable and competitive charge such that no particular group or category of ratepayers are considered to be oversubsidising any other for a service that is provided equally to all rateable properties.

It is proposed that the WSC will be highlighted on rates notices as 'Waste Service Charge' from 1 July 2021.

Differential rates

In addition to a fixed charge, Council will declare differential general rates in the dollar according to the use of the land, for rateable land within the Council area, as follows:

- Category 1: (residential) use,
- Categories 2, 3 and 4: (commercial shop, commercial office or commercial other) use,
- Categories 5 and 6: (industrial light and industrial other) use,
- Category 7: (primary land) use,
- Category 8: (vacant land) use, and
- Category 9: (other) use.

Every resident benefits from the general amenity of the Council area in some way. This amenity includes the local economy, general Council operations and the ability of every resident to use Council facilities and infrastructure including parks, gardens, libraries, etc.

The main reasons for providing differential rates are:

- Ability to pay.
- Potential income taxation deductions,
- Materially heavier/lighter use of services by ratepayers/employees/customers/suppliers, and
- To provide a disincentive to withholding land from development.

Note 1 Preliminary advice received from the South Australian State government indicates there will be no significant increase in the levy for 2021/2022 to fund increased costs associated with the operations of the Board. Council has no control over the levy amount which is set by the Minister for Environment and Water.

Minimum Amount

Council uses a Fixed Charge as part of its rating structure instead of a Minimum Rate amount.

RATE REBATE AND RATE RELIEF ASSISTANCE

To address any potential inequities in how rates are levied across the Council area, the following rate relief assistance options continue to be available:

Residential rate cap

Where an owner/occupier/principal place of residence property with a Category 1 (Residential) Land Use experiences an increase greater than 15% in general rates (excluding any rebates/remissions) payable, the amount of the rate rebate is the amount of gross rates for the current year over and above the general rates imposed in the preceding financial year plus 15%. All calculations referenced herein are gross rates figures i.e. exclusive of any rebates/remissions.

The rebate will not apply where:

- (a) Any such increase is due in whole or part to an increase in valuation of the land in the Assessment because of improvements made to it worth more than \$20,000, or
- (b) Any such increase is in whole or part because the zoning of land use category of the land has changed, or
- (c) Any such increase is due in full or part to the use of the land being different for rating purposes on the date Council declared its general rates for the current financial year than on the date Council declared its general rates for the preceding financial year, or
- (d) The ownership of the rateable property has changed since 1 July in the preceding financial year i.e. the residential property has changed ownership and the new owners have purchased the residential property at the new current market value, or
- (e) The subject property boundary(ies) have been altered in some way e.g. subdivision, boundary alignment etc. i.e. the subject property is not the exact same property, for valuation purposes, as assessed in the previous financial year, or
- (f) Other factors considered relevant by the Chief Executive Officer that do not warrant the granting of the discretionary rate rebate.

The rebate will only apply to:

- (a) A ratepayer in respect of their principal place of residence only, excluding second and subsequent properties and all other non-principal place of residence properties, and
- (b) The current financial year only then subject to an annual review.



Vacant land

The vacant land rate in the dollar is usually higher than the residential rate in the dollar. For owners of vacant land who intend to develop that land, in the short term as their principal place of residence, may be entitled to a rebate on Council rates. Applications must be in writing with the maximum rate rebate calculated so that the rates payable are equivalent to the average residential land use.

Postponement of rates – Senior Citizens

Any person holding a South Australian State Government issued State Seniors Card may make application to Council for a postponement of the prescribed proportion of rates for the current or future financial years. All applications for postponement will be considered in accordance with the relevant legislative provisions.

Hardship

Any ratepayer experiencing difficulties in meeting rates payments or experiencing hardship will be able to access payment plans tailored to meet their particular circumstances. This approach has been widened as a result of the impact of COVID-19. All arrangements will be strictly confidential.

Mandatory and discretionary rate rebates

The Local Government Act 1999 requires councils to rebate rates on some land uses (mandatory rebates) and the ability to grant discretionary rebates for land used for the purposes of community benefit provided the land meets certain legislative and Council policy criteria.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND BUDGET MEETINGS

The 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget and proposed Waste Service Charge (WSC) is presented in the context of Council's strategic directions as set out in the Strategic Plan 2020-2024. This Plan reflects the Council's continuing focus on ensuring that the physical infrastructure within the city is fit for purpose and maintained in a cost-effective way. Through implementation of this year's Annual Business Plan and Budget, Council aims to deliver a well-managed, sustainable city environment to residents and ratepayers now and in the future.

Members of the community are encouraged to take part in the community consultation process regarding the Draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget and proposed Waste Service Charge (WSC) before it is finalised and adopted by Council. Consultation also enables comment on the potential distribution of rates across the city and any rate relief options Council should consider or issues it should be aware of when modelling valuation data and determining the distribution of rates for the 2021/2022 financial year.

Council's Community Consultation and Engagement Policy has been amended in recognition of the temporary COVID-19 amendments to the Local Government Act 1999 as per 'Policy Review – C410 Code of practice for conduct of meetings – holding and participating in meeting by electronic means – Report No. AR20/21246'. In accordance with the policy, Council *will publish a notice inviting interested persons to make written submissions within the period stated in the notice (which will not be less than 21 days after the publication of the notice)* in relation to the Draft ABP&B. A public meeting for deputations will not be held.


What is the proposed Waste Service Charge (WSC)?

The cost associated with waste management including bin collection, waste treatment and disposal is not currently identified on individual City of Mount Gambier rate notices as it is included within Council's 'General Rate Revenue'.

To highlight the cost of waste management, Council proposes to adjust its rating structure to remove the waste component from the General Rates and introduce it as a new separate fixed Waste Service Charge (WSC).

The proposed WSC will be administered in accordance with the Local Government Act 1999 and will not be an additional cost to most ratepayers. Council does not intend to raise overall rates and charges associated with the WSC.

Rate notice example (based on 2020/2021 average residential property rates)



*Figures subject to variation based on 2021/2022 rates and individual property.

Why does Council plan to implement the WSC?

The proposed WSC is an environmental decision to make waste management costs visible and clear to ratepayers by highlighting the waste fee for each property on the rates notice.

Waste management is one of the largest costs to the community and Council wishes to encourage ratepayers to consider their personal environmental impact and the costs associated with waste management. The proposed WSC will also bring the City of Mount Gambier in line with neighbouring council areas which already specify waste charges on rates notices.

How much is the proposed WSC and how is it calculated?

The proposed WSC is \$200.00 per year and is calculated based on last year's (2019/2020) and this year's (2020/2021) actual and budgeted waste collection, treatment and disposal costs per rateable assessment.

Who will need to pay the proposed WSC?

The proposed WSC will be charged on the basis of the service being available to a property. It will exclude vacant land and primary production where there is no dwelling on the land.

Will my rates go up as a result of the proposed WSC?

No. It is proposed that the WSC will be financed by reducing the General Rates - Fixed Charge by \$200.00. Therefore, the introduction of the WSC is cost neutral and there is no bottom-line impact on most ratepayer assessments.

However, in the draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget Council has determined that there will be an increase in the overall general rate revenue equivalent to 4.5% in accordance with the Long Term Financial Plan.

How will Council encourage responsible personal waste management with the introduction of the proposed WSC?

The proposed separate WSC will establish the framework to allow for flexibility to provide future incentives for ratepayers who demonstrate good waste management.

Council will continue to work with the community to provide waste education and awareness programs to encourage waste reduction and recycling to divert rubbish from landfill.

Where will the funds for the proposed WSC go?

The proposed WSC will be used to cover all waste associated costs.

In any year that the total WSC results in a surplus, funds will be accounted for in a specific 'waste' reserve as per the Local Government Act 1999, to be used on waste related services.

When will Council implement the proposed WSC?

It is proposed that the WSC will be highlighted on rates notices as 'Waste Service Charge' from 1 July 2021.

How can I have my say about the proposed WSC?

The community is encouraged to provide feedback about the WSC through the draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget and Waste Service Charge community consultation process which will occur from Wednesday 19 May until Friday 11 June 2021.

REPORT RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That Council Report No. AR21/7731 titled 'Proposed Rating Structure and Waste Service Charge' as presented on 16 February 2021 be noted.
- That Council endorse to include in the public consultation process regarding rates and charges, the following two changes to the current rating assumptions and directions (referred to in Council Report No. AR20/80665 titled 'Council's current Valuation and Rating System'):
 - (a) the introduction of a Waste Service Charge at \$200 per year for FY2022

TYPE OF REPORT

Legislative

BACKGROUND

At the 19 May 2020 meeting, where the resolution was passed in relation to the 'Suspension of Green Waste Tag Fees' Council requested a review in mid-2021 to enable a reassessment of the impacts of the suspension of green waste tag fees as part of the 2021/22 preparation of the Annual Business Plan and Budget.

Combined with the Annual Review of the Valuation and Rating System - see previous Council Report - investigations were made around the alternative ways to incentivise rate payers with regards to waste management as part of the overall rating system.

The report proposes the introduction of a Waste Service Charge (WSC) as part of Council's Rating system for 2021/22.

The Local Government Act 1999 (LGA 1999), under Chapter 10 Rates and charges, paragraph 146 indicates 'A Council may impose rates and charges' including:

- General rates
- Separate rates
- Service rates
- Service charges

To date Council imposes rates and charges only under 'General rates', being the Fixed Charge and the Differential Rate.

The Local Government Act 1999 (paragraph 151 (5) indicates that, before a council changes the imposition of rates on land by declaring or imposing a separate rate, service rate or service charge on any land the council must prepare a report on the proposed change; and follow the relevant steps set out in its public consultation policy.

With the introduction of the WSC Council does not intend to raise the overall rates and charges. For that reason, the introduction of the WSC will lead to a similar reduction in the fixed charge general rate.

i.e. Council intends to apply the following formula and assumptions:

- (Fixed Charge + Differential General Rate) FY2021 = General rates FY2021
- (Fixed Charge + Differential General Rate + Waste Service Charge) FY2022 = Council rates and charges FY2022
- Council rates and charges FY2022 / General rates FY2021 * 100% = 104.5% (this 4.5% is consistent with Council's LTFP with regards to rates and charges income.)

PROPOSAL

Service Charge

The Local Government Act 1999 paragraph 155 introduces a service charge as (1) (b) a prescribed service for 'the collection, treatment or disposal (including by recycling) of waste'

For the City of Mount Gambier this charge is intended to include the expenditure related to:

- Waste collection
- Green waste collection
- Waste Transfer Station
- Re-Use Centre
- Bulky waste collection (if this is not financed in alternative ways)

For completeness it is noted that this will include the direct costs that Council incurs for dumping waste at the Caroline landfill, however it does not include the overall financial result of the Caroline landfill. As Caroline landfill is a facility is used as cost/profit centre with a much wider regional impact and major risk management implications and it is not considered appropriate to either subsidise or charge Council's rate payers for regional related outcomes of this facility.

Considering past and FY2021 expenses the amount of the WSC is set at \$200 per assessment

Waste Service Charge in other SA Councils

Within South Australia most Councils do charge a Waste Service Charge. Neighbouring Councils, including the District Council of Grant, Wattle Range Council, Tatiara and Naracoorte Lucindale Council all include a variant of the WSC on their rates notice.

A major advantage of the introduction of the WSC, funded from the fixed charge general rates component, is that it introduces a trigger and incentive to local rate payers about the cost of waste. With the 2020/21 suspension of the green waste tag Council achieved higher levels of waste segregation, impacting the overall waste cost for Council. With the introduction of a WSC such impacts might result in a downward change in the WSC in future years.

At the same time Council is impacted by multiple external factors that influence to cost of waste (including EPA levies, global transitions like the China Sword policy, etc.). By introducing the WSC Council will be more able to communicate the impact of these initiatives on waste costs. Similarly, these matters can be reflected in future WSC.

Application of the Waste Service Charge

The WSC will be charged on the service being available to the property i.e. there is no need to vary the charge based on the question of the land-owner/ occupier is using the service or not, but it is dependent on Council making the service available to the property.

Consequently, when the rate payer who pays for the WSC asks for the service, Council is obliged to deliver this service.

An example where this might be relevant is where a shop might have arranged their own waste pickup, Council will charge the WSC irrespective and where the WSC shops might now put out one bin per tenancy, where this previously did not occur. However, a shop, B&B or unoccupied property, irrespective if they are vacant, will be charged for the WSC as part of their rates and charges.

The WSC will not be applicable to the 'Vacant Land' or 'Primary Production' land where there no dwelling on the land. As of 30 June 2020, this represented respectively 361 Vacant Land and 36 Primary Production assessments.

Accounting for the WSC

The charge is to cover the expenditure related to the collection, treatment or disposal (including by recycling) of waste over multiple years. However, actual expenditure per year may fluctuate, dependent on many factors. As a consequence, in any year that the WSC results in more or less income than expenditure in the area of waste the 'overs' and 'unders' are to be accounted for (per paragraph 155 (5) and (6) the Local Government Act 1999) in a specific 'Waste' reserve, reducing next year's potential increase in the WSC.

Rating structure implications

The result of the WSC introduction will have a different impact on different categories of rate payers. The Vacant Land assessments and the Primary Production without dwelling assessments are excluded from the payment of the WSC therefore the average WSC per assessment results in a lesser figure than \$200 per assessment. Based on June 2020 figures for number of assessments, on June 2020 capital values, a WSC of \$200 and an overall 4.5% combined general rates and service fee charges increase the average rates and charges for all categories of ratepayers will be approximately as per the table below:

It be noted that the actual figures for FY2022 will be different and the above is for general comparison purposes only.

Council wide, the fixed charge will form 36.5% of the general rates (i.e. combined fixed charge and differential rate), while the fixed charge and the WSC combined will form 44.2% of the total rates and charges. For rate payers, including residential rate payers, who pay both the fixed charge and the WSC, the combined fixed charge and WSC will amount to \$713.42 on average, which is 4.5% increase compared to the FY2021 fixed charge of \$682.70.

Process from endorsement to adoption

Council's endorsement for inclusion in the public consultation process allows time for the preparation of the report for community consultation and for the detailed implementation of these changes in Council's systems.

The Local Government Act 1999 paragraph 151 (7) indicates that public consultation policy must at least provide for a publication in a newspaper, advising the public of the report and inviting interested persons to attend a public meeting or to make a written submission. Paragraph 151 (8a) indicates that this report may form part of the council's draft annual business plan and that the public consultation may be undertaken as part of the public consultation required with respect to the council's draft annual business plan.

It is council's intention to combine the report and the public consultation with the draft annual business plan and budget process.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

The Local Government Act 1999 provides the legal parameters which Council works within. Some specific advice might be sought if and when required.

STRATEGIC PLAN

The Strategic Plan 2020 - 2024 - item 3.5 - is focussed on reducing our per capita tonnage of waste from the City going to the Caroline landfill. The introduction of the WSC fits within this plan.

COUNCIL POLICY

Council Policy W125 Waste Management - Refuse Collection requires a review for this purpose.

- Where there are references to 'rateable premises within the Council areas and on which an occupied building is erected' the wording requires updating to reflect consistency with the WSC, which does not limit its applicability to occupied buildings or rateable premises.
- In case the WSC applies to non-rateable premises the clause around weekly collection at non-rateable premises requires updating.
- The policy references to the provision 'on a fee for service basis' organic waste collection. This has become free of charge and some updates are required.

ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS

The implications for overall Council income for FY2022 are minimal, as the WSC is financed from a reduction in the general rates - fixed charge. It will provide Council with the tools to become more

responsive to waste management related costs and sharing the costs and benefits with the community.

There will be economic implications for Vacant Land and Rural properties, as the WSC will be reducing the fixed rate and these assessments are exempt from the WSC, therefore will have an overall reduction in their general rates.

There will be economic implications for assessments that receive a mandatory rebate, as the reduced general rates lead to a reduced rebate in nominal terms - see under Social Implications.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

The introduction of the WSC stresses the importance Council places on waste reduction, recycling and environmental waste management practices in general.

SOCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The WSC has been structured such that the social implications are minimised. By reducing the general rates fixed charge by the amount of the WSC there is no bottom-line impact on most of the assessments for rate payers.

Rebates

Were there will be an impact is in those rateable properties that currently receive a mandatory or discretionary rebate of the general rates. From FY2022 onwards these assessments will now include the WSC of \$200, which will not be rebated. Also, by reducing the general rates by \$200 for the WSC the assessments that receive a 75% rebate will have a reduced rebate of 25% of the \$200 or \$50. This will mean an overall impact of \$250 for these assessments.

Based on the total of 176 properties with a mandatory rebate this means a total of \$35,200 in WSC and an additional \$8,800 in reduced rebate (i.e. increase in rates income). This compares total rates to be levied before rebate of \$326.000. The largest owner in this group is Anglicare SA Housing limited with 91 assessments, followed by SA Housing trust with 26 properties.

For the discretionary rebate assessments (total of 10) - these are dealt with on an individual basis by Council. Most of these (6) are at 50%, with one at 25%, 57%, 29% and 23%

As part of the reporting to the community in Council's community consultation examples will be provided explaining this to the community.

Non rateable assessments

The Local Government Act 1999 allows the application of a WSC to non-rateable premises. However non-rateable assessments are not included for this WSC proposal.

Most of these assessments are Council landholdings (parks, etc.). Further this includes churches and other places of worship, schools & kindergartens, sport clubs, which are legislated as non-rateable.

Council's 'W125 Waste Management - Refuse Collection' excludes these assessments from waste collection, except upon the payment of a separate fee, charged under LGA Act 1999 paragraph 188 - fees and charges, i.e. not under the WSC. This fee is separately from the WSC.

CULTURAL IMPLICATIONS

Nil

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

The introduction of the WSC will have some short-term implications for the officers in the revenue section of Council in the process of introducing this within Council's Authority system.

VALUE FOR MONEY

The WSC will be financed from a reduction in the general rates - fixed charge and is therefore income neutral for Council.

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RISK IMPLICATIONS

The risk of not implementing the WSC is that Council will be less agile in communicating the waste message to rate payers and less able to recover or pass on any future additional or reduced costs related to the collection, treatment or disposal (including by recycling) of waste.

EQUALITIES AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS

Nil

ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNICATION STRATEGY

Any change to Council's Valuation and Rating Strategy requires detailed Community Consultation (see Local Government Act 1999 paragraph 151 (5). Council will align this communication with the community consultation process that will occur as part of the FY2022 Annual Business Plan & Budget process.

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

See under Engagement and Communication Strategy.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

The recommendation is that Council endorses the introduction of the WSC and the principle to finance this from the general rates - fixed charge. More specifically:

- That Council endorses to include in the public consultation process regarding rates and charges, the following two changes to the current rating assumptions and directions (referred to in Council Report No. AR20/80665 titled 'Council's current Valuation and Rating System'):
 - (b) the introduction of a Waste Service Charge at \$200 per year for FY2022

for all assessments where applicable, including properties where Council applies mandatory or discretionary rebates on the general rates, excluding non-rateable properties, and

- (c) the introduction of the principle that the combined General Rates Fixed Charge and the Waste Service Charge will raise approximately 45% of Council's overall rates and charges revenue.
- That Council uses these, and the other rating assumptions and directions referred to in the above mentioned report to prepare Council's Annual Business Plan and Budget for 2021/2022.
- 3. That Council endorses a period of 21 days public consultation detailing the application of the Waste Service Charge to the various categories of rate payers in accordance with the Local Government Act 1999. This consultation will occur in conjunction with the community consultation process related to the Annual Business Plan and Budget process for 2021/22.

REPORT RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That Council Report No. AR21/27084 titled 'Review of Council Delegation Updates May 2021' as presented on 18 May 2021 be noted.
- 2. The City of Mount Gambier (Council) delegates each function or power of the Council listed in the tables attached to Council Report No. AR21/27084 to the identified delegate(s).
- 3. The delegations granted in resolution 2:
 - (a) are granted pursuant to section 44 of the Local Government Act 1999, excepting that the functions and powers of the Council:
 - (i) set out in Division 8, Part 4 of the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 are delegated pursuant to section 93 of the Fire and Emergency Services Act;
 - (ii) under the Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016 (attached to Report No. AR21/27084 and titled Instrument B) are delegated pursuant to section 100 of the Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016.
 - (b) may, unless indicated herein or in the attachments to Council Report No. AR21/27084, be sub-delegated by the Chief Executive Officer or delegate under relevant legislative provisions, excepting delegations under the Fire and Emergency Services Act only permitted to a Fire Prevention Officer.
 - (c) if made to two or more delegates, then each delegate may exercise the power or function independently of any other delegate.
 - (d) must only be exercised by a delegate in accordance with:
 - (i) applicable legislative and other legal requirements; and
 - (ii) due regard to relevant policies and guidelines adopted by the Council;
 - (e) in regard to the following delegations under the Local Government Act:

- section 133: the power to obtain funds does not extend to imposing rates, borrowing money or obtaining other forms of financial accommodation or fixing or varying fees under sections 188(1)(d) to 188(1)(h) of the Local Government Act;
 - section 137: the power to expend funds in the performance or discharge of the council's powers, functions or duties in accordance is limited to funds allocated as part of a budget adopted by the council and the sub-delegation financial limitations set by the Chief Executive Officer;
 - (iii) section 143(1): the power to write off debts is limited to debts not exceeding \$5,000;
- (f) are granted independent of, and severable from, every other delegation granted under this or any other resolution or instrument.
- (g) if determined to be invalid or unlawful will be deemed to be severed from the delegations granted under this or any other resolution or instrument and remaining delegations will continue to operate according to their terms.
- (h) will come into operation on Wednesday 20 May 2021 and remain in force until varied or revoked by resolution of the Council.
- 4. Previous delegations and sub-delegations granted under the legislative instruments and attachments listed in Council Report No. AR21/27084 are revoked this day 19 May 2021.



TYPE OF REPORT

Legislative

BACKGROUND

Delegations are the way in which Council enables other people/bodies (usually Council Officers) to undertake the many functions required for the day to day administrative activities of Council.

Section 44 of the Local Government Act 1999 provides that the Council may delegate a power or function vested or conferred under this or another Act to a Council committee, a subsidiary, an employee, an employee occupying a particular office or position, or an authorised person. Other Acts also contain specific powers of delegation.

Council conducted a comprehensive review of delegations in March 2021 based upon a new and expanded delegations framework prepared by the Local Government Association (LGA) to provide a simpler and more contemporary approach to managing delegations.

The current delegations (and sub-delegations made by the Chief Executive Officer) are accessible on the Council website <u>https://www.mountgambier.sa.gov.au/council/governance/registers</u>.

This report presents updated delegations based upon changes made to the LGA template delegations since March 2021 as summarised in the following table:

Council uses the template delegations and processes as provided and updated by the Local Government Association, and amended to suit the specific circumstances applicable to the City of Mount Gambier, to ensure appropriate delegations are in place to support the activities of Council in a compliant manner.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

The making of delegations (and sub-delegations) enables the Council to give effect to the strategic and policy objectives of Council through the many and diverse transactions and activities undertaken by the administration on a daily basis.

An absence of appropriate delegations would necessitate decisions being presented to a formal meeting of Council, which for routine administrative matters would be a resource intensive, inefficient and untimely decision making process.

VALUE FOR MONEY

The use of delegations (and sub-delegations) enables the Council, Chief Executive Officer and other Council Officers to direct decision making to an appropriate (sub)delegate to enable efficient and effective administration of the many and varied and routine functions of Council.

RISK IMPLICATIONS

It is imperative that delegations are validly made as the consequences of ineffective or invalid delegations include:

- the exercise of power may fail i.e. the decision may be liable to being overturned by a court
- the cost of a successful challenge to an unlawful decision will likely be borne by the Council
- where an unlawful decision causes loss or damage the Council may be liable.

Whilst the abovementioned risks are at the extreme, the most likely risk of ineffective or invalid delegations is on the capacity of the administration to perform the day to day functions of Council for the benefit of the community in an efficient and timely manner.

If decision making is limited to the Chief Executive Officer or the Council then the pace with which decisions can be made and implemented will reduce and administrative resources associated with the formalities of presenting matters to a higher authority for decision will increase.

A balance is appropriate whereby all decision makers understand the context within which decisions are made and the expectations with regard to exercising, or not exercising, delegated powers.



It is important to note that a delegation provides authority but not an obligation for a delegate to exercise the delegated power. Accordingly, some decisions may be escalated to a higher authority for consideration and determination where the delegate considers it appropriate.

It should also be noted that delegations (or sub-delegations) are revocable and in any event do not prevent the Council from acting in a matter that has not already been determined.

EQUALITIES AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS

Nil

ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNICATION STRATEGY

There is no legislative requirement to actively engage the community on the making of delegations.

A person is however entitled to inspect the record of delegations and in support of this a full extract of the delegation register is published on the Council website. This is proposed to continue.

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

The implementation of updated delegations (and sub-delegations) is proposed to follow the same existing process as for recent reviews and updates using a delegation software register.

Once delegations are made by Council, the Chief Executive Officer will re-make sub-delegations to other officers, with all (sub)delegations recorded in the delegation (software) register, electronic records management system, published on the Council website, and notified to sub-delegates.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

This report recommends that Council grant updated delegations for the legislation listed in the report background in the form contained in the tables attached to Council Report No. AR21/27084.

The recommendations contain conditions associated with the grant of delegations and include the revocation of pre-existing delegations and sub-delegations associated with the relevant instruments.

BACKGROUND

On 15 December 2020 Council endorsed Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre as the official name for the facility being constructed at Olympic Park, Margaret Street Mount Gambier following significant community consultation for name suggestions and a community vote.

With construction underway, Council are now working towards the operation of the facility in preparation for it's opening in Autumn 2022 including the development of a brand for the facility. A brief was prepared to guide the development of a brand identity for the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre that reflected the landmark nature of this facility and Boandik name. A space that will elevate and enhance community connection, wellbeing, culture and identity. A high quality year round venue that can host regional, state and national sporting events providing significant social and economic benefits to Mount Gambier.

Reports were presented and noted at the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre Committee meetings on 9 March 2021 and the 13 April 2021 providing updates on the process.

Following the completion of a competitive Request for Quote process, KWP was contracted to provide design services and develop the brand identity, with the commitment to present a draft for feedback by 21 April 2021 before completing the final brand for endorsement at Council on 18 May 2021.

PROPOSAL

With construction of the facility underway the timeline for the brand development is compressed to ensure that we meet contractual requirements and do not create any delays for the project. BADGE Construction requires the endorsed brand identity by 21 May 2021 for inclusion in the facility signage package.

At a Designated Informal Gathering on 28 April 2021, KWP presented 2 design directions for consideration and feedback, with the preference being to proceed with the development of direction 1 for the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre brand identity.

This report presents the preferred design as a complete brand identity which includes a logo in various formats and a style guide including approved fonts, colours and guidelines.

I, Councillor Christian Greco, give notice that at the next Ordinary Meeting of Council to be held on 18 May 2021, I intend to move the following motion:

MOTION

- 1. That Council Report No. AR21/25923 titled 'Notice of Motion Resignation of Economic & Environment Committee Presiding Member' as presented on 18 May 2021 be noted.
- 2. That the resignation of Cr Christian Greco from the position of Presiding Member of the Economic & Environment Committee be noted and accepted.
- 3. That a nomination process (and if necessary, a secret ballot) be conducted forthwith for the position of Economic and Environment Committee Presiding Member, as follows:
 - (a) The term of appointment for the Presiding Member of the Economic and Environment Committee be until the commencement of the next election caretaker period, or such earlier time as Council may determine.
 - (b) The Chief Executive Officer (or any other Senior Officer present) shall be the returning officer to count votes, draw lots (if/as necessary) and declare the ballot result.
 - (c) A nominee need not be present at the meeting but must have provided a written acceptance to the Chief Executive Officer prior to consideration.
 - (d) The Mayor may vote on the question of Presiding Member appointment.
 - (e) A Member not in his or her seat at the meeting does not vote.
 - (f) The candidate with the highest number of votes (or where two or more candidates receive the equal highest number of votes the first name drawn in a lot) shall be declared as being appointed to the position of Presiding Member.
 - (g) A division cannot be called for on the ballot result as declared.
 - (h) The Mayor may accept a motion to endorse the ballot result, however the motion shall have no effect on the ballot result as declared.

RATIONALE

In putting forward my interest for the role of Deputy Mayor I undertook to step down as the Presiding Member of the Economic & Environment Committee. I hereby notify Council of my formal resignation from this committee position, creating a vacancy.

I have attached an extract of clause 12.5 of Council's Conduct of Meetings Policy C410 together with relevant Motions for a process to be conducted to nominate and appoint my replacement.

I commend this Notice of Motion to Council.

12.5 APPOINTMENT TO COMMITTEES AND OTHER BODIES AND ORGANISATIONS

This policy provision applies when Council has been requested or is required to nominate or appoint a Member or any other person to fill a vacant position on any Committee or as delegate/representative on an outside body or organisation.

Where these policy provisions are inconsistent with any legislative or statutory provisions or the Terms of Reference or other governing instrument of any Committee or other body or organisation, then those other provisions shall apply and override this policy (with the exception that Council may, subject to any statutory prohibitions, override the Terms of Reference of its own Committees)

The Chief Executive Officer shall notify Members of the request and/or requirements associated with the vacancy, including details of the Committee/Body/Organisation Terms of Reference and other relevant information, and will seek a written nomination of any Elected Member, Council Officer or other person with appropriate qualifications and/or experience.

Where Council is required under a legislative or some other requirement under Terms of Reference to seek community or independent nominees to Committee positions, then a public notice shall be published in a newspaper circulating in the area seeking interested persons to nominate within 21 days (or such other period as may be required). Such nominees may also be sought through a targeted process to identify suitable nominees.

The Chief Executive Officer shall present details of all nominees for vacant positions to the next available Council meeting together with a recommendation and draft resolutions that Council may endorse a secret ballot voting process and appoint the Chief Executive Officer (or any other Senior Officer present at the meeting) as Returning Officer to declare the result and draw lots (if/as necessary).

The following shall apply to the appointment of Committee Members and delegates/representatives on other bodies and organisations:

- A nominee need not be present at the meeting, but must provide a written acceptance to the Chief Executive Officer prior to consideration.
- Candidate nominees should display the qualities sought to fill the vacant position including relevant skills, experience and interests.
- Prior to commencing the secret ballot process, by passing a resolution, Council:
 - i. may determine not to nominate or appoint any person to fill a vacancy.
 - ii. should determine the term to apply to the nomination/appointment, that may survive the next general/periodic election.
- The Mayor may vote on the question of position appointments to Committee's and other bodies and organisation's.
- A Member not in his or her seat at the meeting does not vote.
- The candidate with the highest number of votes (or where two or more candidates receive the equal highest number of votes the first name drawn in the lot) shall be declared as being nominated/appointed to the vacant position.
- A division cannot be called for when a vote on the question of appointing a person to fill a vacant position is taken.
- The Mayor may (but is not required to) accept a motion to endorse the filling of the vacant
 position however any failure or variation of the motion shall be of no effect on the result of
 the secret ballot.
- Council may determine to appoint proxies/deputies to certain positions to ensure representation in the absence of selected members/delegates/representatives.

- assist with advocacy that supports Council's resolved position on the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre; and
- to provide strategic advice regarding the building and operationalisation of the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre.



Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre Committee

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1 NAME

1.1 The name of the Council Committee shall be the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre Committee (in these Terms of Reference referred to as "the Committee").

2 INTERPRETATION

- 2.1 For the purpose of these Terms of Reference, unless inconsistent with the subject matter or context:
 - 2.1.1 "Act" means the Local Government Act 1999 and includes all Regulations and Schedules.
 - 2.1.2 "Committee" means the Committee of Council established pursuant to clause 3.
 - 2.1.3 "Committee Member" means the persons appointed by the Council to the Committee pursuant to clause 5.
 - 2.1.4 "Commencement Date" means the date on which the Committee is established and becomes operative pursuant to clause 3.
 - 2.1.5 "Council" means the City of Mount Gambier that established the Committee and to which the Committee reports.
 - 2.1.6 "Presiding Member of the Committee of Council" means the person appointed to that position pursuant to clause 5.
 - 2.1.7 "Observers" means those persons attending any meeting of the Committee of Council, but not having a vote on any matter to be determined by the Committee and not having been appointed as Committee Members.
 - 2.1.8 "Sub-Committee" means a sub-committee established in accordance with the Act.
- 2.2 Any words, phrases or terms used in these Terms of Reference that are defined in the Act shall have the same meaning as are given in the Act.
- 2.3 A reference in these Terms of Reference to a "singular" includes a reference to the "plural" and a reference to a "plural" includes a reference to the "singular".
- 2.4 These Terms of Reference shall be interpreted in line with the provisions of the Act.
- 2.5 Notices

2.5.1 All communication to be given to the Committee shall be addressed to:

3 ESTABLISHMENT

- 3.1 The Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre Committee is established under Section 41 of the Local Government Act 1999.
- 3.2 The Committee will be established and become operative from the time a resolution of the Council is passed.
- 3.3 The Committee is established by the Council to provide considered advice to assist decision making on matters associated with the development of a Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre.

4 OBJECTIVES

- 4.1 The Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre Committee has been established to:
 - provide advice to assist Council in decision making on matters associated with the grant application and development of the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre;
 - conduct and/or assist with stakeholder and community engagement;
 - assist with advocacy that supports Council's resolved position on the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre;
 - to provide strategic advice regarding the design and operationalisation of the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre; and
 - to make recommendations to Council on the future name of the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre.

5 MEMBERSHIP

- 5.1 Membership of the Committee will comprise up to eight Councillors.
- 5.2 The Mayor has Ex-Officio membership on this Committee.
- 5.3 The Committee has the right to co-opt individual members who have special expertise to assist the Committee under its objective. Such co-opted members have the right to attend meetings and participate in discussion but will have no voting rights on the Committee.
- 5.4 Council will appoint a Presiding Member.
- 5.5 Council reserves the right not to appoint any nominee, to remove and replace any coopted member.

6 QUORUM

- 6.1 At all Meetings of the Committee a quorum must be present.
- 6.2 A quorum will be determined by dividing by 2 the number of Members formally appointed to the Committee ignoring any fraction and adding 1 (excluding Mayor as ex-officio).

7 MEETINGS OF THE COMMITTEE

- 7.1 The Committee shall hold ordinary meetings at least bi-monthly.
- 7.2 No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Committee unless a quorum of Members is present.
- 7.3 The Presiding Member, when physically present, shall preside at all meetings of the Committee and at any other time the Committee shall appoint an Acting Presiding Member who shall preside at that meeting.
- 7.4 Each Member of the Committee including the Presiding Member present at any meeting of the Committee must vote on any matter requiring determination and all decisions shall be decided on a simple majority of votes cast.
- 7.5 Each Member of the Committee including the Presiding Member present at any meeting of the Committee shall have one deliberate vote only.

8 PROCEDURES AT MEETINGS

8.1 The procedure to be observed in relation to the conduct of meetings of the Committee is in accordance with Local Government (Procedures at Meetings) Regulations 2013.

8.2 In accordance with s89 of the Act, insofar as a procedure is not prescribed by regulation, it shall be as determined by the Council, and insofar as a procedure is not determined by the Council, it shall be as determined by the Committee itself.

9 LIABILITY OF THE COMMITTEE

- 9.1 A liability incurred by the Committee rests against Council.
- 9.2 No liability attaches to a Member of the Committee for an honest act or omission by that Member of the Committee in the performance or discharge, or purported performance or discharge, of the Member's or the Committee's functions or duties.
- 9.3 All members of the committee are bound by the Council Member Code of Conduct as published in accordance with Section 63 of the Act.

10 DELEGATION

10.1 The Committee has no delegation to act with all recommendations of the Committee (and of any Sub-Committees established by the Committee) to be considered by full Council for final decision and resolution.

11 SUB-COMMITTEES

- 11.1 The Committee may establish a Sub-Committee to assist it in a matter directly related to the Committees objectives.
- 11.2 When establishing a Sub-Committee the Committee must set out the Terms of Reference for the Sub-Committee.
- 11.3 The Committee may appoint to a Sub-Committee Council Members who are not members of the Committee, Council Officers and members of the public with skills or expertise in a field relevant to the matters which the Sub-Committee is established to assist with.
- 11.4 A Sub-Committee established in accordance with this clause will report to the Committee and will have the same meeting notice, minute keeping and procedural obligations as the Committee as defined in the Act.
- 11.5 If a Sub-Committee Member is absent from 2 or more consecutive meetings of the Sub-Committee without an apology accepted by the Committee and Council then that Sub-Committee Members position shall be considered vacant.
- 11.6 If a Sub-Committee established under this Clause 14 fails to achieve quorum on 2 consecutive occasions then the Sub-Committee will be considered to be in recess and the Chief Executive Officer is to present a report to the Committee for consideration.

12 MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE

- 12.1 The CEO or his appointee must cause minutes to be kept of the proceedings of the Committee.
- 12.2 Minutes of the Committee shall be available to all Members of the Committee, Council and the public.
- 12.3 The Minutes of the proceedings of a meeting are to comply with the requirements of the Act.
- 12.4 Minutes of the Committee Meeting shall be submitted for confirmation at the next meeting of the Committee and if confirmed, shall be signed by the Presiding Member or other person presiding at the subsequent meeting.

12.5 Minutes of the Committee Meeting and any recommendations (including the minutes and recommendations of any Sub-Committee established by the Committee) shall be submitted to Council and shall be of no effect until endorsed as a resolution of Council.

13 AMENDMENTS TO TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 13.1 It will be lawful for the Council by resolution to revoke, vary or add to any of the provisions of these Terms of Reference at its own discretion within the parameters of the Act and any other relevant legislation.
- 13.2 Notwithstanding 16.1 hereof before the Council resolves to revoke, vary or add to any of the provisions of these Terms of Reference it may, but will be under no obligation, to obtain the opinion of the Committee.

14 INTERPRETATION OF TERMS OF REFERENCE

14.1 Should there be any dispute as to the definition and/or interpretation of these Terms of Reference, or any part thereof or any irregularities whatsoever that are unable to be resolved by the Presiding Member then the Council shall determine the dispute and the decision of the Council shall be final and binding.

15 WINDING UP

15.1 The Council may cease the operation of the Committee and the Committee may make such recommendation to the Council on the completion of its function.

BACKGROUND

As part of the land division to create the residential allotments within the subject locality of Wehl Street North and Wireless Road West the developer was required (by the Development Act) to either:

- 1. Provide 12.5% in area of the land to be developed to be vested in the Council to be held as public open space; or
- 2. Make a monetary contribution prescribed by the Development Regulations.

When this locality was first developed the developer provided an amount of land available to be developed as a reserve on the corner of Wehl Street North and Wireless Road West. This land has been vested in Council and the land has been maintained to a low standard with minimal improvements for a lengthy period of time.

It is highlighted that the development of this area had not been completed due to a strategically located piece of land being in different ownership.

PROPOSAL

The developer now owns all of the land within the subject locality and is now in a position to complete this area for residential development.

A land division has recently been approved creating 44 residential allotments (DA 381/D010/2020). A copy of the approved plan of division is attached for Members information.

As part of the approval for this land division the developer was required to pay \$137,104 into the Council Open Space Fund (44 allotment @ \$3,116/allotment) rather than the provision of additional land to be developed as open space.

The developer by letter dated 30th March, 2021 requested a meeting with Council to discuss a concept design for the reserve on the corner of Wehl Street North and Wireless Road West. A copy of the letter and a copy of the Concept design is also attached to this report for Members information and perusal. At this time the developer also requested if part of the open space fee could be reduced or contributed towards the proposed development of the reserve.

A meeting was held with the developer, the General Manager City Growth, Acting General Manager City Infrastructure, Manager Operations and Engineering and Manager Development Services on the 15th April, 2021 to discuss the proposal.

At this time the ability to develop the reserve as an urban nature park was discussed including the following features:

- A pond and overflow pond as part of the stormwater management for the area
- Nature play area; and
- Improved landscaping including trees, park seating

This would help to minimise the amount of regular maintenance required for the reserve including mowing and improve the amenity value and character of the subject locality.

Council is unable to reduce the payment to Council's Open Space Fund as this is a legislated requirement implemented as part of the development approval for the Land Division. However, Council is able to use the money within the Open Space Fund towards improvements and the development of public open spaces.



LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

The design of the proposed urban nature park will need to be prepared through the receipt of appropriate landscape design to ensure any features are suitable to be placed within a public place to minimise any risk to Council.

STRATEGIC PLAN

Open spaces are important as they provide places for people to meet, socialise, play and connect and access to these areas is associated with increased physical activity and improved mental health. The goals of the Strategic Plan which this proposal relates include Our People, Our Location and Our Diverse Economy and Our Climate, Natural Resources, Arts, Culture and Heritage. Prime references to the Strategic Plan include 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 2.1, 3.2, 3.3, 4.2, 4.3 and 4.4.

COUNCIL POLICY

Council is currently working on the preparation of a Sport, Recreation and Open Spaces Strategy. This strategy is currently on community consultation/engagement.

ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS

The development of the reserve will require an investment of money into the reserve. The benefits of undertaking an upgrade of this reserve will also have economic benefits through an improved urban environment and improved health and well being for the community.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

Open spaces and reserves play an important role in minimising environmental impacts through the planting of trees and the management of the quality of stormwater

SOCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Open spaces and reserves add value to the quality and amenity of the urban environment and provide opportunities for people to meet, socialise, play and connect.

CULTURAL IMPLICATIONS

N/A

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

Council is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the reserve. The proposal to upgrade the reserve may involve a financial contribution from Council, however as part of the proposal it is hoped the final design could reduce the ongoing maintenance work required to be undertaken by Council.

Council currently uses money available through the Open Space Fund towards the upgrade of reserves and open spaces throughout the City.

VALUE FOR MONEY

There is no current budget allocation for the upgrade of this reserve. Council could use the open space contribution to be paid by the developer towards this project. Council could also negotiate an agreement with the developer to jointly undertake this project.

RISK IMPLICATIONS

Community risk can be managed through the development of an appropriate landscape design for a community/public space.

EQUALITIES AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS

As public open space, the community as a whole is able to access and use the reserve. An appropriate landscape design would include ways to manage these implications.

This would be managed by a project plan and proposed timeline for work upon the satisfactory development of an appropriate landscape design/plan.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION


Open spaces and reserves are an important asset throughout the City. Council needs to determine if it is willing to upgrade the existing reserve as approached by the developer, and whether it is willing to contribute towards the proposed development as part of the required Open Space Contribution associated with the land division as recently approved by Council.

Prior to proceeding with the development of the reserve, Council engage a suitably qualified landscape architect to development a concept plan and design for the reserve including costs in consultation with the developer, Versace Home Builders.





1 Introduction

1.1 Background

The Blaxland, Wentworth and Stirling Court division creates 44 allotments, reserves, and road extensions north west of the intersection of Wireless Road West and Wehl Street North, Mount Gambier.

The aim of this report is to provide details on the ability of the site to manage the increased stormwater created by the division, and clarify ownership and maintenance obligations, in the form of a Preliminary Stormwater Management Plan.

The SWMP is developed to meet the performance criteria set out in the EPA publication 'EPA Guidelines for Stormwater Management in Mount Gambier'.

This is achieved by utilizing the natural limestone infiltration characteristics combined with the retention basin, infiltration bore and gross pollution traps to achieve 1:100 year retention (EPA require a minimum of 1:1 year retention) while also meeting the pollution reduction targets set out in the Guidelines.

1.2 EPA Requirements

The requirements of the EPA are outlined in their letter dated 13th April 2018, which also includes reference to:

- > EPA Guidelines for Stormwater Management in Mount Gambier (EPA, 2007)
- Water Sensitive Urban Design Greater Adelaide Region Technical Manual (Department of Planning and Local Government, 2010)
- Stormwater Pollution Prevention Code of Practice for the Building and Construction Industry (EPA, 1999)

 Proposed Road and Drainage Works Plan, Concept Basin Design (Scott Campbell Design and Drafting, Rev 1, September 2020)



2 Assessment

2.1 Site Analysis

The proposed basin is in the South East corner of the estate, bounded by Wehl Street North, to the east, and Wireless Road West to the south.

The areas draining to the proposed retention basin are Catchments CA2, CA3, and CA4, while Catchment CA1 drains to an existing basin – refer to Figure 2.1 below. The total catchment to the proposed basin consists of 4.65 Ha of development area.



Figure 2.1 Wehl Street South East Basin Catchment Plan

The engineering survey of the existing basin has been examined to determine its height-area- storage relationship, as summarised in Table 2.1.



2.2 Basin Design for Retention and Treatment

The proposed basin will provide both retention and stormwater treatment to be compliant with the *EPA Guidelines for Stormwater Management in Mount Gambier* (EPA, 2007). This basis of design calls for the following:

- Storage and disposal of 'everyday' minor rainfall events, up to the 1 year ARI 1 hour duration event, via infiltration through the basin floor
- Disposal of flows in excess of this threshold via a drainage bore, with sufficient storage within the basin to contain the 100 year ARI event.



A typical section of this arrangement is shown below.

Figure 2.2 Retention Basin Typical Section (EPA, 2007)

For this Preliminary SWMP we have calculated the 1:100-year retention volume to be 403 m³. We propose to calculate the 1:1 volume during detailed design, which will set the level of the lower of the two bores shown in Figure 2.2 above.

- High Level Outlet (1:100-year event): To achieve retention volume of 403m³ for major rainfall events, is approximately 47.9 AHD.
- Low Level Outlet (1:1-year event): To be confirmed during detailed design (and reported in the Final SWMP)

To achieve the 1:100-year retention volume the basin will be approximately 200mm deep.




2.3 Evaluation

2.3.1 Minor storm retention, disposal by infiltration

A MUSIC stormwater model has been established to evaluate the long-term performance of the proposed arrangement.

6 minute rainfall data recorded at Mount Gambier Aerodrome (Station 026021, Jan 1942 – July 2010) was selected as an input to the model. The MUSIC model was established to reflect the basin as an infiltration basin, with overflows passing through a proposed gross pollutant trap (SPEL Stormceptor), with the receiving node representing the existing drainage bore.





A conservative infiltration rate of 3.6 mm/hr was adopted for the basin. We believe the actual infiltration rates will be closer to 30mm/hr but will adopt 3.6mm/hr at this stage until we have the actual infiltration results.

The MUSIC model found that 69% of the total flow volume is disposed by infiltration (i.e. only 31% disposed via the drainage bore).

2.3.2 Water Quality Improvement

The MUSIC modelling results confirms that the water quality improvement prior to drainage bore discharge would be achieved as summarised in Table 2.2.

2.3.3 Major Storm Retention

The proposed basin has a storage volume of 430m³ available at an AHD of 47.9m (0.2m deep).

Stormwater Retention computations have been carried out based on maintaining Pre-Development flows and determining the retention volume based on the site's Time of Concentration.

2.4 Maintenance Responsibilities

The existing basin and associated drainage assets will be under the care, control, and ownership of the City of Mount Gambier. There may be a 12 - 18-month maintenance period immediately after completion of works before the City of Mount Gambier accept ownership.

2.5 Construction

A preliminary Environmental Management Plan has been prepared to provide guidance on the measures that should be considered during construction to mitigate against adverse impacts during the land development and building construction stages.

This plan is contained in Appendix B.




