moved that pursuant to Sections 152(1)(c), 153(1)(b) and 156(1)(a) of the Local Government Act 1999 and in order to raise rates in the amount of \$ the Council hereby declares that differential general rates will apply and will vary according to the use of the land and declares the differential general rates for rateable land within the Council area for the 2014/15 financial year will be as follows:

COMMENTARY:

If Council decides to delete or reduce funding for Blue Lake Walking Path Lighting Project (\$450,000), the following options have been prepared for Council's consideration. (Noting that Council has previously resolved to go to tender for this project with tenders closing on 16th June, 2014.)

Option 4.1:	Given that \$450,000 expenditure has been deleted from the Budget it stands to reason that the corresponding revenue raised (rates) to provide for that expenditure should also be reduced.
Option 5.1:	An alternative to Option 4.1 is to still raise that revenue via rates but apply it against debt - essentially borrow less.
Option 6.1:	Is a 'hybrid' alternative providing for the lighting project to proceed but staged over two financial years and reallocation of the
	uncommitted 'revenue' against new or increased operating expenditure.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council adopt the 2014/15 Revised Business Plan and Budget (no. 2) which;

- incorporates all Schedule I adjustments considered last Budget meeting (previously resolved)
- provides for the provision of \$450,000 for the completion of the Blue Lake Walking Path Lighting Project
- provides for minor Budget deficits (\$44,000 operating / \$85,000 cash deficits)
- maintains the basic structure of the draft Budget that went to consultation including the required rate revenue increase of 4.8% and level of loan borrowings.
